Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Parish Meeting was held on 6th March when Mr Cirin of the County Council gave a most interesting and informative presentation on Emergency Planning. This is now a Government Strategy Plan requirement for County, Borough and District Councils and includes services such as Fire, Police, Ambulance, Health Authorities, Councillors and voluntary bodies. An overall committee draws up the strategy plan and is responsible for the training of personnel to be instantly ready as soon as an emergency or disaster is reported, such as a rail or air crash, or the Buncefield site in Hertfordshire.

Parish Council Chairman, Peter Hartop, gave a report on the work of the Parish Council over the last year, which included the co-operation between the council and Beds Highways on reporting defects on the roads, erecting bollards on the Jubilee Lawn and the grinding down the tree stumps on the Green. The Parish Plan had been completed which had given the council a comprehensive blueprint for the future. He also gave details of the support the council had given to the Margaret Alleyway Trust in purchasing the field beside the slipway, and the proposals by Mr Williams Robinson for a recreation ground as an outcome of a planning application for 3 houses on a field in Old Road.

Other items were the removal of the damaged bus shelter in Radwell, when the opportunity was taken to install a new one away from the Radwell Green area. Many planning applications had been commented upon, likewise the Government's proposals for re-organisation of local government and the formation of Unitary Authorities. Peter concluded by reminding those present that the Parish Council was up for election in May, the same time as the elections for the Borough Council and the Mayor.

The Clerk gave a financial report. The precept for 2007/08 had been set at £12,500. A number of costs had risen, such as power for street lights and audit fees, with grass cutting being one of the largest outgoings in the budget. The cost of the new bus shelter had been met by the insurance claim for the damaged shelter.

Reports were also received from the Parish Plan Group, the P3 Footpath Group, and the Village Hall Committee. The Borough and County Councillors answered questions during the Open Forum.

A short Parish Council meeting followed, when progress on work on the causeway was reported. It was also reported that there had been an instance of horse riders riding along the pavement on the Radwell Road. Riders are respectfully reminded that pavements are for pedestrians.

After some discussion, the council voted to award the contract for grasscutting to Chris Horne who currently cuts the grass in the parish. The next bulky waste collection will be in Radwell on 28th April from 3.00 – 5.00 pm and in Felmersham on 29th April from 1.00 – 3.00 pm.

The date of the next Parish Council meeting in May is to be decided. Please watch the website, notice boards or Ouse News for details.
