Many thanks from the PSA & Village Hall Committee – we look forwarding to seeing you on 16th July.


A Worrying Year

The very long dry spell of weather this year has serious implications for us all. For the farmers there are the concerns about the quantity and quality of the growing crops as well as worry about the adequate feeding of their livestock. For gardeners there are concerns about maintaining the growth, flowering and cropping of their produce. There are concerns for all of us that food costs may rise as fresh fruit and vegetables become scarcer. The longer the dry spell persists the greater concern that even more difficulties may arise. Drought conditions are relatively rare in this country, we tend to complain about rain and wet weather and take the general availability of water for granted. We hear accounts and see pictures of the effects of droughts in other parts of the world which are often in the news, but we do not expect to have such terrible problems in our own country. Indeed the situation in our own country is still very much better than it is in so many countries, most of us still have an ample water supply provide to our own houses, we do not see animals dying in the fields through lack of food and water, we do not face starvation as the consequence of crop failure. Perhaps it is good that we are reminded from time to time how fortunate we are to live in such a relatively benign climate with rare excesses in seriously adverse weather conditions. Perhaps it is good that we are reminded that our climate seems to be changing, and many believe that this is the consequence of man's abuse of the resources of the planet on which we live.

In the book of Genesis we read of how God created the world, and everything that is in it. God gave the stewardship of the planet into the hands of man. Wise stewardship of God's creation would ensure that the development of the generous resources given by God would be for the benefit of us all. Climate changes could be seen as the warning of the serious consequences for the whole of mankind that will result from the abuse and selfish exploitation of those generous resources that were given by God. If we are wise we will heed the warnings that we are being given, and work to ensure that those generous resources are used wisely in a way that is beneficial for all God's created world.
