The Show is non-profit making, the entry fee going towards the cost of printing the schedules and providing small prizes for the children, and is run purely with the aim of providing a day of friendly competition in the two villages. We are very grateful to Milton Ernest Garden Centre for their continued sponsorship, to the WI for organising the teas, the Village Hall Committee for the use of the Hall, and to our judges without whom we could not run the Show.

As ever, the Show is open to all residents of Felmersham and Radwell and to children who attend Pinchmill Lower School and Pre-School. Everyone is welcome to join in - we try to make the classes as varied as possible, so if you enjoy gardening, cooking, craftwork or photography there's something in the show for you. You might not find fame and fortune but you could win a coveted Show prize card and gift token - and you might just win the show plate!

SHOW RULES

1. Entry fee will be 30p per class (free for junior classes) and must be on the official entry form.
2. In all classes, the exhibits must have been grown or produced by the exhibitor.
3. All exhibits must be taken to the Hall by 10.30 am on the day of the Show.
4. All reasonable care will be taken of the exhibits and no-one other than judges or members of the committee will be allowed in the Hall until after judging is completed.
5. All classes will be judged, but prizes other than first will only be awarded if there are sufficient entries in that class.
6. The 'Show Plate' will be awarded to the entrant gaining the highest number of 'Firsts' during the Show.
7. Exhibits should be collected between 5.00 and 6.00 pm.

VEGETABLES

Class No.

1. Five potatoes (red or white – any one variety)
2. Three onions
3. Three carrots
4. Three beetroot
5. Five tomatoes
6. One truss of cherry tomatoes
7. Two lettuces – any variety with roots
8. Five runner beans
9. Five French beans
10. The heaviest marrow
11. The heaviest potato (one washed)
12. The longest bean
13. “The Best I’ve Got” – 1 vegetable from the garden or allotment



FRUIT

14. Three dessert apples
15. Three cooking apples
16. Three pears
17. Six plums
18. A plate of blackberries with calyx, no more than 30 on the plate
19. A dish of any other fruit not in the schedule.
20. “The Best I’ve got” – 1 fruit from the garden or allotment

FLOWER CLASSES

21. One rose in a vase (specimen)
22. A vase of garden flowers
23. Flowering pot plant
24. Foliage pot plant
25. “The Best I’ve got” – one flower from the garden or allotment

COOKERY

26. A jar of jelly
27. A jar of any stone fruit jam
28. A jar of soft fruit jam
29. A jar of orange marmalade
30. A jar of pickles
31. A jar of chutney
32. A Victoria Sponge
33. A savoury tart (Quiche Loraine or similar)
34. Four decorated cup cakes
35. Loaf of bread any type, plain or speciality, oven baked or bread machine



CRAFT

36. Small item of patchwork
37. A hand knitted article
38. An item of cross stitch or tapestry
39. “All My Own Work” Any unscheduled craft medium.

40. ‘Snow’
41. A Portrait
42. Colour print “So this is Summer”
43. Black and white photograph, any subject.

COMMITTEE SPECIAL CLASS (To be judged by the Show Committee)

44. The Great Disaster (For those whose efforts came to nothing. Entries can be a failure in any category. If it’s very bad it might win a prize!)

JUNIOR CLASSES (No entry fee)

Open to all Felmersham & Radwell children aged 12 and under on the day of the Show, and children attending Pinchmill Lower School and Pre-School.

4 yrs and under

45. “My House”. Picture, collage or model – any material.

5 - 8 yrs

46. An edible necklace.
47. A monster made from recycled materials

9 – 12 yrs inclusive

48. Four decorated fairy cakes. (Cakes can be bought or home-made).
49. A monster made from recycled materials.
50. A decorated flower pot (decorations can be painted or glued on)



Showing Tips:

Try to choose vegetables of a good shape and of even size. Go for quality, not size, unless entering “heaviest” or “longest”. Wash root vegetables carefully - don’t scrub! Leave calyces on tomatoes.

Pick fruit as near to the day as practicable - retain stalks. Don’t polish fruits - leave the natural bloom.

Select flowers in good fresh “condition”. Remove any dead or damaged blooms or foliage.

Finally, but most importantly, read the schedule!
