ROBIN GRAHAM - George Galliver It is probably only those who have lived in the parish for more than 10 years who are likely to have known Robin Graham, who died on November 26th aged 73. Robin was an Ulsterman who came to the mainland before World War 2 to follow a career as a technologist and a manager in the food industry. He came to this district as one of the founders of the Unilever Research Laboratory at Colworth House, where he became Deputy Head of Laboratory. At first he and his wife Grace lived in Higham Ferrers, but then they built Trevor Barn in Radwell the name being taken from an ancient barn on the Colworth estate from which the building stone for the bungalow was obtained. When he retired in 1972 they moved briefly to Riseley, and then to Hundersly in Norfolk where he died. Whilst in this Parish they took a keen interest in village affairs. Grace founded and ran the Three-in-One club, and Robin was chairman of the Parish Council at an important time in the development of the village. They were both faithful worshippers at St Marv's, and staunch supporters of it's activities. My association with Robin was not in Felmersham. but as a colleague at Colworth House. 

CHURCH RESTORATION - Fred Best
You may like to know a little more about the restoration programme
than was mentioned in the recent fete programme. The PCC are
anxious to put Phase IV in hand as soon as possible. This
consists of 3 elements, the costs of which are given below, in
round figures at present day prices.

- 1. Drainage from the aisles is now by means of high-level chutes. Large volumes of rain-water therefore fall with some force down the stone walls, causing damage especially near the ground. Down-pipes need to be installed to convey the water away safely; this will cost about £2,000.
- 2. The stonework of the south transept is in very poor condition, especially around the window, and the coping stones could become dangerous in the near future. We also need to provide proper lead flashing between the transept walls and the walls of the aisle, to prevent water getting into the Memorial Chapel during heavy rainfall. This work is estimated to cost £9,000.
- 3. The third element consists of generally similar work to the porch. This is estimated to cost $\pounds 8,000$.

The total cost of Phase IV is therefore in the region of £19,000, and the PCC has towards this, including the proceeds of the Fete, some £6,000. However, we cannot start any of this work until we learn the outcome of our application for a grant from English Heritage, who have normally in the past contributed 40% towards the cost of our Restoration programme. There is also the possibility of a grant from the Historic Churches Association Trust, which might amount to £1,000. There is therefore currently a shortfall of at least £5,000

It is hoped that when Phase IV has been completed the church will be safe and waterproof, so that only routine maintenance to the fabric will be required.
