TALENT SCHEME

47 of the Parishioners who attended the Christmas Carol Service on
December 18th kindly took up the challenge to employ their
personal talents to raise money for those in our own country
whose personal circumstances deny them many of the comforts and
advantages which we so often take for granted. They received a f1
coin, together with an introductory letter from Douglas Claypole
White, which I have reproduced below in the hope that other
Parishioners, including some who were not present at the Carol
Service, may wish to volunteer their talents for this cause.

"In April 1988 the Church Urban Fund was set up by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York to raise eighteen million pounds to help those living in deprived urban areas over the next 20 years. Obviously this fund is not going to be able to rebuild the inner cities or to restructure them in any fundamental way but it will be able to concentrate on making grants to supplement local funds for a wide variety of small projects, aimed at providing Christian care, support and guidance for those in our own society who are disadvantaged by circumstances which are often outside their control.

Project examples include :-

the provision of counselling and back-up for the elderly and the disabled in Walthamstow.

the funding of a professional counsellor in Dagenham to work in an area where there is a high incidence of drug usage and where many of the addicts are young couples with children.

a Youth Club in Brixton organising outings and visits for

teenagers outside Brixton.

As its contribution to the Church Urban Fund, The St.Alban's Diocese has been asked to find £800,000, and we in turn have been set a Parish target of £757, of which £200 has already been donated. The PCC are hoping that the balance of £757 can be raised by individual members of the Parish, through the use of their individual talents.

On behalf of the PCC, I am today entrusting you with a f1 coin, following Our Lord's well-known parable of the Talents (Matthew Chapter 25, verses 14 to 30). Between now and Easter 1989, we would ask you to apply your personal talents in order to make it grow! We hope that between 75 and 100 Parishioners will join in this fund-raising scheme. With 75 participants, each f1 will need to generate on average a further f10, if we are to achieve our target; if 100 people take part, each f1 will need to generate on average a further f7.50.

I should be very grateful if you would return your f1 coin together with your talent proceeds to our PCC treasurer, Stephen Hill, (46, Marriotts Close, Felmersham), or me, or any member of the PCC, no later than Easter Sunday 1989."
