WHAT PRICE INDIVIDUAL FREEDOM? — Editor

I am sure we have all been moved by the events in Eastern Europe over the last three months, and have marvelled at the extent of personal commitment, generosity and sacrifice that has been aroused, both in the countries concerned, and amongst their neighbours and friends throughout the world. There is a growing recognition that all peoples deserve the freedom to choose for themselves how they will be governed, and have the right to influence the society in which they live.

We in Western Europe have enjoyed those privileges for so long that it is perhaps hard to imagine a life of restriction under dictatorial authority. But it is not just dictators who have the power to limit freedom. There are many occasions where our own inadvertent actions can unwittingly restrict the freedoms of others. Recognition of the rights of the individual implies consideration for others, and that means allowing them the same freedoms that you would wish them to extend to you.

As if by way of example, I have in the last month received comments from two parishioners, who have asked to remain anonymous, but wished to draw my attention to situations of inconsiderate behaviour within our own community.

One of these concerned the parking of cars in locations that limit visibility, restrict access, or obstruct gateways. Such behaviour was particularly alarming in this case, because access by Emergency services was impeded, and the safety of children playing in the street was put at risk.

The second comment was prompted by conversations overheard on Public Transport, and concerns the widespread and increasing use of vulgar and offensive language by some of the school children in our community. The offending words generally add nothing to the content of the conversation, and seem to drop so easily from the tongue that it is hard to imagine that they are only used outside the home, or out of parental hearing. Although such behaviour falls short of direct personal abuse, it still causes genuine offence, and should not be condoned. Moreover, if present trends continue unchecked, the richness of our English language heritage will be lost forever.



Following the erection of scaffolding in early October the stonework will be closely inspected and photographic records taken. This will be followed by a period of fine spray cleaning to remove all incrustations. After accurate measurement of the perished stonework, the masons will spend the winter months making replacements, ready for fitting in the early spring. By starting the work immediately, it is hoped to avoid the effects of inflation. However it does commit us to raising the final f5,400 over the next 9 months. This will not be an easy task because we have almost exhausted all our sources of income outside the parish. We therefore still need your support. THE WEST FRONT COLUMN - Ken Shrimpton
Target f60,000: Total Raised or Promised f58,927
Conservation and Restoration

The act of restoration often destroys the very thing which one is seeking to preserve. No matter how well executed, a modern replacement of perished stonework will always be a 20th century copy of the original. Also, over the centuries, some stonework on the West Front has already been replaced, so that what we see today is a historical patchwork of Early English architecture.

I am therefore particularly pleased to report that both architects involved in the West Front restoration are approaching the work with sensitivity. The emphasis will be on conservation rather than restoration. Much of the original stonework will be retained, and only as a last resort will perished stonework be replaced. For instance, despite its very poor state, the dog-toothed decoration inside the arcading will not be replaced; instead it will be preserved with 40 coats of lime wash.
