Our Patronal Day Revd David G Mason

On Sunday 5th September we will be celebrating the feast day of our Patron Saint, St Mary the Blessed Virgin, this being the nearest Sunday to her principal Feast Day on the 8th September, the traditional day of her birth. Saint Mary is unusual in having 6 special days in the Calendar dedicated to her, you may remember that we also celebrated a festival held in her name on the 15th August. Mary, the Mother of Jesus is mentioned several times in the Gospels, mainly around the birth and childhood of Jesus, and then at his crucifixion, where Jesus commits her to the care of St John.

Most Churches are dedicated to a Saint or Saints, sometimes they were named after a Saint who was buried in the building, but mostly they were dedicated to a Saint whom those building (or were having built) believed would be someone very special to follow as an example of faithful obedience to, and love of, God. The use of such an example can be very useful, particularly when we are finding the Christian life hard going. The knowledge that others have been there before us, and been given the strength to cope with even the hardest parts of the Christian journey, can be a source of comfort and encouragement at those times of sorrow and loneliness.

In recent years there has been a great interest in Icons, those pictures produced in the Orthodox Churches which are intended to guide us through the illustration and bring us nearer to God. I believe that we should regard the Saints as Icons, using the example of their faithfulness to God, and the way in which they followed Jesus as a pointer to Christ. In that way we will avoid the danger of attaching too great an importance to the Saint at the expense of Jesus. Paul had some strong words to say about this to those who became obsessed with various leaders in the early Church. We must have Christ as our leader, with the Saints as sign posts on the way, unmistaken for the final destination.
