Parish Council Maggie Spoor

Five Councillors attended this meeting held on 7th November 2000 . Apologies

from Eric Barford and Brian Smith.

Changes to the electoral boundaries will mean the end of 'Felmersham Ward' at the next local elections in 2002. Subject to ratification, we will in future be linked with Carlton and Turvey.

Felmersham bus shelter will be receiving a face lift. John McKenzie will make a start on repairing rotten roof timbers and replacing lost and broken tiles shortly. The next phase will be to renovate the interior.

David Cook had pruned the trees next to the bus shelter and discovered that some of them showed signs of rot. Following consultation with David Alderman, County Tree Officer, David reported that the recommendation was that they be trimmed by 25 - 30%. Quotations are being sought and the work will be carried out over the winter. We would also need planning permission for this work.

The Parish Paths Partnership (P3) is now an active and thriving group. They provided a detailed and interesting report on their work. This included details of the proposed improvement work to the bridle path which runs from Sharnbrook Mill to Radwell. They also propose to erect an illustrated map board in Felmersham giving information on public paths, wildlife, etc.

The budget for 2001 – 2002 was discussed.

Marjorie Pipe and Maggie Spoor reported that they had attended the hearing held by Beds Health Authority in October on the application for a pharmacy in Sharnbrook. There have been widespread objections to this application because of the implications for residents and for the two local practices. A decision would be made at a closed hearing on 20th November. (The application has been refused, although the applicant can appeal).

Lighting on the Marriotts Close footpath steps was discussed. It was agreed to seek a quotation to replace the two bulkhead lamps with a single lamp post of good design, and replace the existing concrete lamp post with one to match.

We requested the 30mph limit on Old Rd. be extended beyond Swansholme.

Marjorie Pipe and Mike Thomas reported on the annual reception held at County Hall for Parish Councils. The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Wednesday 9th January 2001


