Village Trades and Services	

At the Parish Council Meeting on 4th January - 5 Parish Councillors, the Clerk and 5 members of the public attended. Apologies were received from Geoff Hulatt.

The Chairman read a letter of resignation from Councillor Mike Thomas. The Chairman's expressions of thanks for Mike's contributions to the Parish Council over the last 12 years were minuted.

<u>Parishioners Talk Time</u> Item raised – the Borough's performance regarding the list of necessary works/services within the parish that had been given to the Mayor during his recent visit. Some satisfaction that a few complaints had been dealt with, but the majority of work on the list is still outstanding. Rubbish collection over the Christmas period had, however, been excellent.

Information from the Clerk re: Government proposals. The Clerk advised Councillors of recent Government proposals. Despite the freeze on local authorities this does not extend to Parish Councils who may raise expenditure by 2.5% before being capped; and in future, any expenditure over £500 must be published.

<u>Highways</u> The weight/length sign for Memorial Lane has still not been erected, and, despite the Mayor's recent assurances, there are a number of highway works still outstanding in the parish. The new lamp post for outside the church has been ordered and a quote has been obtained for the new 'village gates'. These last two items are funded by Borough Councillor grant.

<u>Finance</u> The quotation from Mr Muskett for street light maintenance for the coming year (£184) was accepted. Councillors voted to maintain the parish precept for 2011/2012 at £12,500.

Date of next meeting: Tuesday 1st March at 7.30 pm in Pinchmill Hall. The last meeting before the Parish Council elections in May.

Paul Davis (of Pavenham Road) and his team have developed wound healing technology which was featured on BBC Breakfast TV on Friday 7 January as part of Breakfast's "Pioneers" series. They found a way to utilise some of the ingredients - including a pure form of honey - to deliver a new healing principle based on oxygen and iodine. The new products, called Oxyzyme and Iodozyme, give faster healing and can heal wounds that have remained static for years.

Felmersham and Radwell Parish Council used Cllr Jim Brandon's allocated funding to purchase a new street lamp. It replaces the old 60s style lamp outside St Marys Church. The new lamp is more appropriate for a rural setting next to the medieval church and its bulbs are energy efficient and cheaper to replace.
