Before the publication of parish maps the only way of passing on information about parish boundaries was by word of mouth and a ritual known as "Beating the Bounds". Walking the parish boundaries was a common, ancient custom whereby elders of the parish could pass on their knowledge to the next generation and at the same time show them the parish boundary stones. The ritual was normally carried out at Rogation Tide when the rector, churchwardens, local officials and many of the parishioners walked the bounds. Food and drink were taken and it was a very festive occasion.

Part of the ritual involved 'beating' the young men with willow and turning them upside down and 'banging' their heads on the boundary markers, lest they forget where these were. There was, however, a serious side to the ceremony, whereby if subsequently a parish boundary was in dispute then evidence of its position could be established

In Felmersham parish, the Court Rolls of 1608 describe a *Perambulation of bounds of parish of Felmersham as made by Nicholas Craven, clerk, vicar there, Robert Burly, Reginald Cox and other inhabitants.* There then follows a detailed description of the route taken, part of which is as follows: *Begin at the church and going directly N to the river, and leaving the river on the left hand and field called Le Townfield on right, go as far as the mill called Pynche Mylne, then N to bridge called Cony bridge, and leaving bridge on left and meadow of Edward Mountague knight on right go directly E having river left and Radwell commons and Radwell meadows right.............*

This year, and weather permitting, we are organising a parish Rogation Sunday "Beating the Bounds" walk from Felmersham Church at 4.00pm (after the Duck Race). The walk will take us to Sharnbrook for afternoon tea in St. Peter's Room—we promise not to beat, or bang the boys' heads on the boundary markers along the way! After tea there will be Rogation Sunday Choral Evensong at St Peter's Church to which all are very welcome. We look forward to you joining us.



OBITUARY

Michael Templeman 6th May 1943 – 24th January 2012

Michael was born in Birmingham, won a scholarship to Kings Edward's School, and read Natural Sciences, and then Economics, at Selwyn College, Cambridge. He joined the Inland Revenue in 1965, taking charge of his first district after his marriage to Jane in December 1970. In December 1972, he was promoted and sent to Head Office in London, and the family, including baby Kathryn, arrived in Felmersham. Charlotte, Judith and Rosalind arrived in the next few years. Michael spent most of the rest of his Revenue career at Head Office, finally becoming Under-Secretary in charge of Financial Institutions. In 1994, he joined Schroder Investment Bank as Group Tax Director, where he spent 14 intellectually stimulating years; he was also a member of both the CBI and the Institute of Directors.

At home, he enjoyed life in Felmersham, walks in the Nature Reserve, and membership of the table-tennis club and the pub quiz team – a favourite pursuit. He was very attached to, and supportive of, St Mary's Church, and continued to worship there after our move to Turvey. He encouraged the girls' musical activities both in the church choir and in the county orchestras; he was for many years Chairman of the Friends of Bedfordshire Youth Music

Michael had an abiding interest in history and historical places, enjoyed running and later walking, especially in Dorset, and enjoyed cruising holidays, with crossword or a 'killer' Sodoku to hand. Through all of this was woven his passion for cricket. His favourite birthday present was always 'Wisden', and he knew scores and match information for any year one cared to mention.

He retired in 2008, and then joined the Ministry of Justice, sitting as a member of the First Tier Tax Tribunal. He died suddenly and unexpectedly at home - 'in harness', as he would have wanted

Michael found practical problems very challenging, and could be alarmed and irritated by broken-down cars and minor domestic disasters. However, he was a livewire with an incredible memory, and an immense ability to solve intellectual problems. Above all, he was a devoted family man - loving, kind and generous, steadfast and reliable, and tolerant of his women's various whims. We miss him more than words can say.
