Dear Friends,

On Saturday 30th June at 4.00pm in St Albans Cathedral, Thomas Sander will be "priested." This is another word for ordination, the process by which someone is made a priest.

Early July, or in Tom's case late June, around the time of the feast of St Peter, is a time that many denominations use to ordain people to be deacons or priests. The process and ceremonies may vary between each, but generally speaking ordination is the process by which individuals are consecrated, that is, set apart.

This goes beyond 'blessings' – a wish or pronouncement that God is with you; but rather it is intended to be making a change happen. Most of us think of events as being 'before' or 'after' a certain time or happening. For mothers, life is divided by the birth of their first child, 'Before Baby was born ... after Baby arrived....'.

With ordination, the intent is that a similar profound change occurs. It's not something you can erase or forget or pretend it didn't happen. Even if a child were to die, the mother would still be a mother: nothing will ever change that. And so it is with consecration.

Once someone or something is consecrated, it is changed into something or someone set apart for a specific use by God. This is NOT to say that all deacons and priests are holier or closer to God than other people, just that they are set apart to do His work.

Tom was ordained Deacon last year and Priest this year, and that means there are certain things that he can now do that he couldn't before. Most notably he can now celebrate communion, but he can also now perform weddings and he can pronounce the absolution of sins during services.

Tom will be with us for another couple of years or so as the Curate and I wish him well on this next stage of his journey. Being consecrated, or "set apart" can be a great joy and privilege, but it is not without its difficulties!

DID YOU KNOW?

INVENTIONS: DISSOLVABLE PILLS

In 1884 William Upjohn, a US doctor from Michigan, invented the first pill that could dissolve in the stomach.

Upjohn had the innovative idea of introducing a starter particle into a revolving pan. As the pan turned, the starter was sprayed with powdered medicine, building up the new pill layer by layer. The number of layers controlled the strength of the pill. The resulting "friable" (easily crushable) pill dissolved when ingested. Prior to Upjohn's development, patients had to ingest drugs in liquid form or as pills with hard coatings. The problems were that the dosage of liquids was inconsistent and the pill coatings were so hard that they did not always dissolve, meaning that patients received no benefit.

After patenting his invention in 1886, Upjohn developed a machine to mass-produce his pills. With his brother he set up the *Upjohn Pill and Granule Company*. He sent small pine boards to thousands of doctors together with samples of his "friable" pills and his rivals' hard pills, inviting the doctors to crush the pills into the boards to see which one was the most digestible.

Early Upjohn products included quinine pills and the first laxatives. The dissolvable pill is still in use today.
