Dear Friends,

Some of you may be aware that I am not adverse to the odd pint in one of our local hostelrys. This being so, I meet some in our parish who I would not otherwise meet, those who don't come to Church or who don't belong to any other parts of village life. I have to say that I have had some of my most enjoyable, deep conversations in this context.

One evening a few months ago a woman about my age said to me "I would like to get married in the village Church, but I'm not a Christian – I think all that God business is a nice idea, but not true". Normally I would be inclined to smile and accept this decision, sticking to the rule that the two subjects to be avoided in local hostelrys are religion and politics, but emboldened with Charles Wells Courage, I decided I'd challenge her view. "Why", I said "why don't you believe, what makes it such a problem?" "Proof", she said. "you can't prove to me that God exists, you can't show me him, there is no evidence." So I asked, "Is proof that important, do we have to live by it all the time, is it not possible to sometimes trust and hope in something that is not just yourself?" "No" she said, "you have to have proof, to show that something is true, we can't go living our lives without proof!" "OK" I said, "I'll make you a deal...I'll marry you in Church, if you can prove to me that you love your fiancé" – Silence followed. We clinked glasses and agreed a date for the wedding.

The common assumption made in our modern society is that 'truth = proof', religious faith allegedly is unable to live up to this maxim. However, what I would like to stress, as in the conversation above, is that there is so much that we value as humans, which is unproven, indeed which exists beyond the bounds of proof; the desire for freedom and justice for others, the ability to love until the end and above all the irrationality of offering your whole life to someone else. We are not merely evolutionary machines, but individuals who love, hope and pray beyond ourselves.

God is beyond the bounds of our total knowing – that isn't to say that we can't know him, but to say that God isn't some 'thing' to be pinned down into a petri dish and dissected to the point that we understand him. To know God is to come to him in prayer, to understand him is to begin to follow him in faith.

People often say to me "I don't understand Christianity", and I always say "that's because it's not something to be just understood, but something to be lived."

£400 EACH WEEK!

That is how much it costs to keep St Mary's Church open! I guess it comes as a surprise to most people to learn that it is such a large figure.

St Mary's church has two accounts: a Restoration Account and a General Account. The Restoration Account is ring-fenced, i.e. money given to the Restoration Account cannot be used for the General Account. It is the funds within the General Account that are used to run the church and it is this account that needs an income of approximately £400 per week.

In 2011 the income to this account was £18,686, half of which came from planned giving (i.e. monthly, quarterly or annual standing orders), and the other half came from church collections, one-off donations, gift-aid tax recovery, fees and activities.

During 2011 we spent £19,350 or £385 per week. So where did we spend this money? We paid £13,436 to the Diocese of St Albans which they use to pay the clergy, house them, train them and provide them with a pension - in other words to pay for our parish priest. The second largest expenditure was insurance at £1,994. Then there is everything from electricity to printing, from a Christmas tree to bread and wine for the sacrament, and the out-of-pocket expenses of the clergy. There are no moats to be cleaned and no duck houses to repair, but despite our best efforts it all adds up.

As a Christian church we have a policy of looking outwards. In 2011 we gave £830 in charitable donations most of which we raised through ring-fenced fund raising events or collections. For example the proceeds of the harvest festival go to relieve hunger in the third world and the Remembrance Sunday collection goes to the poppy appeal.

With inflation running at around 3% we expect our running costs this year to top £400 per week. If you feel you can help to keep St Mary's church open by making regular contributions please contact Stephen Hill on 781064.
