Dear Friends.

At this time of the year the days begin to noticeably lengthen, in fact the day lengthens by an hour and six minutes during the month. So, as the word indicates, LENT begins on Ash Wednesday, this year on the 5th March. Each time it comes around we are given a chance to know more of God and give to him more of ourselves and our love. That is the positive and liberating purpose of keeping Lent. This time of year is always forward looking – an invitation to adventure – to go beyond where we are. Some things during Lent will be repetition – but never mere repetition – rather they will be a creative and more disciplined doing of what lies at the core of Christian discipleship.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer, the courageous Lutheran pastor, writing from his prison cell in 1944, said of our various Christian observances: In our traditional rites and ceremonies we are groping after something new and revolutionary without being able to understand it or utter it yet. That is our own fault. During these years the Church has fought for self-preservation as though it were an end in itself, and has thereby lost its chance to speak a word of reconciliation to mankind and the world at large. So our traditional language must perforce become powerless and remain silent, and our Christianity today will be confined to praying for and doing right by our fellow human beings. Christian thinking and speaking and organisation must be reborn out of this praying and action. Those words remain thought provoking. They push the boundaries and clarify much of what the churches have been struggling with in our lifetime.

Looking back, every Lent will have been less successful than we would have liked. In the famous phrase, yes we will have missed the mark. But we face the truth to set us free. Truth is never discouraging precisely because it opens up the chance to start again. Here is the way to find hope and rebuild our intentions. Jesus' words spur us on, *anyone who wishes to be a follower of mine must leave self behind; he must take up his cross, and come with me* (Mark 8:34).

All we shall be doing in our congregation between Lent and Easter should help us to attend more closely to the call of Jesus and respond better to him. Daily prayer; nightly compline; definite, directed study; conversations and encourage- ment from our companions who share with us the bread of life; all provide vision, strength and determination. Through Lent we travel together not alone.



FLOODING INFO

Recent flooding has once again caused inconvenience to residents of Felmersham and Radwell. Probably the most annoying thing is to motor from Felmersham to Radwell or vice versa only to find the road is flooded. "Uh, if only I had known, I would already be at Pavenham!". Well here is the good news, help is at hand, and those who are members of Felmersham Forum already know this.

Go to www.felmersham.net and click onto the "Real Time Flood Information" icon on the left hand side of the page. This will take you to a general flood information page about the local flooding. On this page you will find a link to the Environment Agency website for the actual (i.e. real time) river levels at Sharnbrook Mill. Currently the assumption is approximately as follows:

River Level = 0.76m then Radwell will be flooding

River Level = 1.15m then Felmersham will be flooding

Observations confirm the correlation is approximately right within 0.025m (i.e. 1 inch)

Clive Just has used this information to produce a traffic light colour coding system to interpret how the above observations MIGHT relate to flooding at Radwell and Felmersham Bridges. There is a link to Clive's coding system. It is only a rough indication – so you have to make your own decision on whether it is safe to pass or not.

IN CASE OF AN EMERGENCY IN TIMES OF FLOODING

Should you be unfortunate enough to need to call 999 at a time when the river has flooded the primary access roads into the village please communicate this as part of the call. The dispatcher is then able to advise the crew of the best route to reach you following information that you supply them.

Recently an ambulance was called at 4pm on Boxing Day and it didn't arrive in the village until 4.55pm The delay was caused by the Luton crew not knowing that the roads were flooded and then not knowing how to avoid them. The Highways Agency should inform all emergency services of flooding but the message doesn't always get through to the crews on the ground.
