METHODIST MINISTER'S MUSE

Water, water everywhere, nor any drop to drink... Wherever we turn at the moment there seems to be water. Our hearts and prayerful concern go out to all whose lives and businesses who have been, and continue to be, so deeply affected by the recent weather. Whether we have suffered no more than inconvenience or have experienced personal loss the last few weeks have, for many of us, revolved around regular viewings of the news and weather forecast and trying to work out which bridges are passable from looking at *felmersham.net*. As a relative newcomer, I have been very grateful to those of you who have shared your expertise and local knowledge, helping us to acclimatise to an area more used than some to having to cope with so much water.

Nature is for us a two-sided coin. Bringing tourism and natural resources into our area on the one hand, the river Great Ouse can also become a source of anxiousness and destruction. How can we reconcile our need for the richness of natural resources on the one hand with the need for security and protection from the elements on the other? Throughout time there has been the tension between enjoying the world in its raw state and taming it to suit our own purposes. The dark storm clouds are at once awe-inspiring and threatening; thunder can be thrilling and menacing; swollen watercourses are picturesque yet alarming. When we look out of the window in that first glance at the clouds in the morning, we can have no idea of what the day will bring – from the point of view of weather, or from the more personal angle of the events that will confront us.

Biblical themes that spring to mind are the rainbow after the storm, illustrated in the narrative of Noah, reminding all of us that the hard times are not the end and that through it all God is with us, bringing light and refreshment and new life to come. This is picked up in Isaiah 43:2 "When you walk through the waters, I will be with you, and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you". Whatever we are facing, God-in-Christ IS there with us. There is no place, geographically or emotionally, that Jesus will not go to be by our side, sharing with us our pain and our anxiety, our struggles and our despair. As we

approach Lent and begin to consider once again the entirety of the Easter Story, let us be comforted and strengthened by the knowledge that Jesus went through everything that we do and more beside, and yet overcame even death itself through the grace and love of God.

As storms are to rainbows, so is the cross to the empty tomb. May the God of resurrection be your strength and your hope and bless you in all your ways.

WHAT'S ASH WEDNESDAY?

Ash in the history of Israel has always been understood as a sign on penitence, mortality and sorrow. In the Bible ashes are traditionally used to express remorse, a longing for change and at times a sense of loss.

In Genesis Jacob, on learning of the death of his son Joseph, "tore his garments, and put sackcloth on his loins, and mourned for his son many days." *Genesis 37.34*.

Daniel, the faithful man of God, in praying for the people of his day seeks an answer from the Lord "by prayer and supplication with fasting and sackcloth and ashes." *Daniel* 9.3.

Jesus in a stern call for repentance exclaims to the unrepentant in his own day "Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the deeds of power done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago in sackcloth and ashes." *Matthew 11.21*.

From the Middle Ages it became customary to use this biblical symbol of Ash at the start of Lent as a means of recognizing our own personal need for sorrow and repentance, as well as a recognition of our own mortality. The main theme of Lent is one of personal longing and striving to be ready to live in the light of eternity, which Christ offers to us by his cross and resurrection. Through the liturgy of Ash Wednesday we begin our journey towards the life changing events of Easter with a sombre resolve to strive to be faithful to Christ in all that we do. In the service of Ash Wednesday we are marked on the forehead with the sign of the cross with the following words:

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ."

As Lent begins we seek to turn away from all that we do through ignorance or weakness or deliberate fault, which separates us from the eternal love of God. Our resolve at this time is to be faithful, to seek the goodness of God in the land of living and to trust in his unfailing love and compassion as we return to him in heart and mind.

Begin Lent well...

LENT – what's it all about?

Are you one of those people who have "given it up for Lent"? Perhaps it's alcohol, or chocolate, junk food, smoking or (dare I say it) your iPad or perhaps Facebook? Will you keep it up? The 40 days of Lent refers to the number of days and nights Jesus spent alone in the desert without food, being tempted by the Devil.

Why is it called Lent? As Robert Evens wrote in last month's edition, Lent is an old English word meaning "lengthen" and is observed in spring, when the days begin to get longer. It begins on Ash Wednesday which this year is on 5th March. Ash Wednesday is preceded by Shrove Tuesday (shriving Tuesday) which some see as the last chance to indulge themselves before Lent begins! This day is also referred to as Pancake Day.

Lent continues for six and a half weeks until Easter and during this time Christians remember the execution of Jesus and then celebrate his rising from death. The last day of Lent is Holy Saturday, the day before Easter Sunday (Easter Day) when, once again, it has become the custom to give chocolate eggs to children (and hopefully, wives, mums and grandmas too – who are sure to share with the men!!).



W.I. May Mills

How many of us have a piece of Denby pottery dating back to the year dot? Sue and Bruce Edwards' superlative collection dates back to the early 19th century (apparently one of the properties of clay produced stoneware is longevity!) Denby's enduring success is that they embraced innovation in manufacturing techniques and design beginning with salt glazed bottles for liquids and containers, circa 1809; decorated tableware, circa 1910; glazed and coloured ware, circa 1920; designer pieces for the sitting room, circa 1950. Green was the first colour used for glazing and we saw a number of styles of tea-pot including the '4 o'clock tea set' comprising tea-pot, jug and sugar bowl.
