

MESSAGE FROM REV. GILL BAALHAM

Longing for a bit of Peace and Quiet.....

Have you noticed that deck-chairs are back in fashion? I wonder what makes the summer for you? Is it the swallows – or the cuckoo? Is it the sound of the ice-cream van coming round the village or the anticipation of sand between your toes? Maybe, for you, the summer brings back memories of family holidays, Punch and Judy, donkey rides and sandy sandwiches on the beach. Colin Hill spent 30 years in the Metropolitan Police Force but his claim to fame, and the reason he was here to talk to us, was his three years as a Royal Protection Officer during the late 1980's. Notes on the Felmersham & Radwell Parish Council meeting on Tuesday 6th May 2014

The Annual General Meeting of the Parish Council was postponed until the July meeting due to the absence of some councillors.

A 20 mph speed limit has been agreed for Moor End Road, Radwell, but Borough Council support for a 20 mph limit for Felmersham would be subject to further assessment including traffic calming in The High Road. A traffic survey would be carried out by councillors.

A number of serious potholes, particularly in Church End and Hunts Lane that had been notified to Bedford Borough Highways last year, still need repairing. A blocked culvert in Hunts Lane also needed clearing.

A survey of the street lights in the parish would be carried out to find out which lights need refurbishing as many had been erected more than 40 years ago.

Trees have now been planted by the Parish Council in the verge in front of the wall of Radwell Court.

Despite numerous requests to Anglian Water, a leaking sewerage pipe near Radwell was still unrepaired. The Clerk will make further contact with Anglian Water.

The entrance to Stonepits, Carlton Road has not been re-instated, an Enforcement Order is still outstanding.

The council members present agreed the annual accounts for the year 2013/14, following internal audit by Mr Doyle.

The council agreed to seek a quote for the cleaning and repair of the War Memorial in Felmersham.

Following a meeting in December with Dave Hodgson, the Mayor of Bedford, sadly, neither the Chairman nor the Clerk had received replies to their follow up e-mails.




