Dear Friends,

Midway through Lent, we have refreshment Sunday, it's also called Laetare Sunday, which means "O be joyful Sunday." Another name is Rose Sunday, because if we had them, on this day the priest would wear pink vestments. But most people know it as Mothering Sunday. But whatever we call it, it is a time of enjoyment and a relaxing of the Lenten rules of austerity. There is an old Jewish saying: God could not be everywhere, and therefore He made mothers.

Mother Church, Mother Earth, Mother of the Gods - our human mothers - all of them have been part of the celebration of 'Mothering Sunday' - as the fourth Sunday in Lent is affectionately known. It has been celebrated in the UK since at least the 16th century.

During the Middle Ages, young people apprenticed to craftsmen or working as 'live-in' servants were allowed only one holiday a year on which to visit their families and their Mother Church- which is how 'Mothering Sunday' got its name. This special day became a day of family rejoicing, and the Lenten fast was broken. In some places the day was called Simnel Day, because of the sweet cakes called simnel cakes traditionally eaten on that day.

For me this Mothering Sunday will be a particularly poignant day as it will be on that day that I will take the last services in the benefice before taking on my new role as Rector in the benefice of Ashwell, Hinxworth and Newnham in north Hertfordshire.

It will be nearly ten years since I came here as Rector and for those with long memories, before that I spent two and a half years as curate here, working with Ian Arthur. As some of you may also know, it was with some reluctance that I came back after my curacy. I felt somehow that it would be wrong to comeback. In the end after much soul-searching I applied to comeback and I am glad I did.

The last ten years have been a huge privilege and although there have been tough times, there has been much, to return to the Laetare theme, to be joyful about. I would like to thank you all for the opportunity to serve in this parish and for the journey we have shared together.

You would have thought that Roy Pettit's talk entitled 'A Brief History of Doing Time' would be rather grim, but once he had covered the topics of public floggings and hangings, and the very grim conditions of prisons until post-Victorian times, things lightened up with anecdotes of his time as a prison officer. We had interesting tit-bits such as the possible origin of 'living on a shoe string' being the fact that because prisoners had to pay the jailer for everything including food, some would hang a boot over the wall in the hope that passers-by would drop in a penny or two. His singular experiences of a lifetime as a prison officer and eventual Governor of Bedford Prison proved to be an eye-opener to the law-abiding citizen, and you have to wonder if the 'doing time' of the title does not apply to him?

The tradition of baking bread marked with a cross is linked to paganism as well as Christianity. The pagan Saxons would bake cross buns at the beginning of spring in honour of the goddess Eostre - most likely being the origin of the name Easter. The cross represented the rebirth of the world after winter and the four quarters of the moon, as well as the four seasons and the wheel of life.



Christians saw the Crucifixion in the cross bun and replaced their pagan meaning with a Christian one - the resurrection of Christ at Easter. It wasn't until Tudor times that it was linked to Christian celebrations. During the reign of Elizabeth I, a decree was issued forbidding the sale of spiced buns except at burials, at Christmas or on Good Friday.

The first recorded reference to 'hot' cross buns was in 'Poor

Robin's Almanac' in the early 1700s: 'Good Friday come this month, the old woman runs. With one or two a penny hot cross buns.' Happy eating!
