LETTER FROM Fr REUBEN PRESTON

Every family has its calendar of significant events, remembered and marked as a family unit: grandma's death, children's birthdays, the arrival of new pets, a traumatic legal battle..... These things shape our life and outlook and affect the spiritual balance of a household, bringing joys and anxiety, tears of sadness and deep moments of feeling part of something valuable and significant.

This month of June has its usual mix of such remembering in our church calendar: from St Julian martyred in Rome in 165AD to the Uganda Martyrs of 1977; from Columba, the 6th century missionary in Iona, to Richard Baxter, a Puritan Divine of 1691; and then from Evelyn Underhill, as a spiritual writer of 1941, to our own St Alban as the first Martyr of Britain in 250AD. These characters have shaped the life and spiritual dynamic of faith by their commitment to God through Jesus Christ as they understood him in their generations.

This June we also embark upon the remembrance of the social reformers of Samuel and Henrietta Barnett (1913 & 1936) whose work contrasts with the Nat-ional Celebrations of Queen Elizabeth II's official birthday festivities on the weekend of 11 &12 June. Samuel and Henrietta dedicated their lives and energies to the improvement of the East of London, and history tells us that their "unorthodox methods, including evening schools and entertainments, aroused much criticism". Nonetheless, Samuel's spiritual gifts, combined with Henrietta's robust energy and assertive personality, made for a dynamic expression of Christian faith.

The work of Samuel and Henrietta was local and it contrasts with the work we celebrate of Queen Elizabeth II whose work has been steadfast, persistent, and patient, grounded in duty and tradition, National and International. We can say little of the Queen's personality - for most of us she is a distant figure with occasional glimpses of her work and life on the TV or at a Garden Party.

A common theme to these contrasts is a desire for stability in the lives of the poor and the Nation and the utilization of the gifts and opportunities of the places where they find themselves. They are grounded in a spiritual commitment to the example and call of Jesus Christ upon their lives. They were not just caught up in present lives hoping for a *better* future but with the Christian ethic of *perfection*. Their Spiritual security and confidence gave them the desire to reach out into the future from a vision of *wholeness* to *perfection* in people's lives: caught up in the call of God who is both amongst us and beyond us.

As you have your household events this month, as you take part in National and Church celebrations, may you be inspired to use your skills, gifts and talents to work for *perfection* in our society, parishes and households.


Alex Smith, Felix and family
