



CHURCHYARD TREE Ken Shrimpton

Unfortunately one of the large horse chestnut trees in the churchyard has come to the end of its life. The large and heavy boughs are rotten inside and at ground level the trunk is also rotten. When covered in leaves the tree presents a large sail area to the wind, and if the wind becomes gale force, there is a risk of the tree shedding a branch or being blown down.

At peak periods Church End is a relatively busy road, and with housing opposite, it presents too great a risk, so unfortunately it will be cut down on the 12th and 13th October. We ask that no cars are parked near the trees on these two dates.

Fortunately, about ten years ago, the PCC had the foresight to plant replacement hornbeam trees in anticipation of this day. These trees are well established and when the horse chestnut canopy is removed, they will flourish.

During the following week other trees in the churchyard will be trimmed as part of normal tree management.


