### **LETTER FROM Fr REUBEN PRESTON**

You will have witnessed the piles of unwanted Christmas gifts arriving at Charity Shops along with the bags of old clothes and CDs being cleared out to make way for the new gifts of Christmas, now a distant thought.

But amidst the bills to be paid and the failed New Year's resolutions, we hear the call of Lent beckoning us to look at our lives afresh with a perspective of faith. For some of us, religious people are a pain in the rump, being filled with 'No's' and prohibitions and reasons why things are not God's will for her world: and also people of faith can be the most grace-filled women and men we could hope to encounter, with hearts and lives looking outward in generosity of spirit to others.

The beauty of our villages to me is the variety of people with different gifts and talents and personalities – all of which God cherishes and desires to nurture into renewed faithfulness. Whether your hobbies are football, dramatics, vegging by the TV, walking the dog or simply getting through this week, the call of Lent to us is to stop and spend some time reflecting on our spiritual nature and eternal purpose - what in old fashioned language is called 'vocation'. Each of us has a 'vocation' to live out, and our true joy and contentment is when we can find for ourselves what that 'vocation' is: be it as a loyal partner, a skilled business woman, a helpful shop-keeper or a visually astute florist...... ourselves and from God's overwhelming desire to meet us in worship and prayer – be it in stillness or exuberant singing.

With pancakes getting nearer at the end of the month maybe you can use this February to reflect on where you want to open your life to the transforming presence of Jesus and accompany him into the wilderness to meet head on the temptations which we can so easily allow to ruin our lives, relationships, faith and spirit. Your vocation is to be a brilliant person in God's eyes - to be his well -beloved son or daughter – or whatever a non-binary might like to be identified as!

Use this February as a time to think about how you might use the approaching Lenten season beginning on 1 March. Happy and reflective February!



**Ken Shrimpton**, our very own local historian, joined us at our January meeting to tell us about 'The Diary of a Felmersham Grave Digger',

In 1929 a Mrs Marshall of Stevington was dusting an old book when some pieces of yellow paper fell out, they were covered in fading writing. These papers were the diary writings of Edward Arpin.

Edward was an agricultural worker and Felmersham Parish Clerk, who was born in Pavenham in 1756 and died in Felmersham in 1836. As Parish Clerk he would have access to scraps of paper through his dealings with the vicar, who also probably taught Edward to read and write. Paper was very expensive in the early 1800's; the wages of an agricultural worker would barely cover food and clothing for the family.

The diaries chronicle the day to day happenings of village life, births, marriages, deaths and of men transported to Australia for petty stealing, which (ctd)



put an extra burden on the parish to look after the families left behind. Seasonal variations in weather conditions and crop failings were also recorded, and there are reports of barn fires and rioting after farmers brought in Irish labourers instead of using local workers. This was the time of the Corn Laws and the fluctuations in the price of bread were an important entry in Edward's diary, bread being a major part of the diet at this time.

All of Edward's entries can be verified with official documents of the period, which makes these diaries a very important part of the history of our beautiful village. They are stored in the archives of Bedford Records Office.

## FELMERSHAM AND RADWELL WAR MEMORIAL AND ACT OF REMEMBRANCE

### **LEST WE FORGET**

Each year on Remembrance Sunday a very moving service is held at our War Memorial. Having attended this now for a second year since moving to Felmersham, I was interested to know more about Harry Burt, William Hood, Thomas E Kemble and Albert S Smith. Their names are on the War Memorial but on the Service Sheet, where details are given about each name inscribed, it says that there is 'no further information' about these men.

On the website www.roll—of-honour.com there is now detailed information about William Hood, but with all the extra information now published on line, was it possible to find details on the service of the three remaining names?

My thanks to **Maurice Nicholson** for providing the following information about **Thomas E Kemble**:

**Thomas Kemble** appears to have arrived in the village just a year or so before the outbreak of the war. Captain George Gerard Montague Tyrrell of the Cottage Felmersham (who arrived himself in 1912 or 1913) employed him as a valet, and they both played for the village cricket team in the summer of 1914. In August 1914 he signed up to join Captain Tyrrell's regiment (the 5th Royal Irish Lancers), as did the captain's groom H Gallant (who survived the war).

Although the War Memorial has his name as Thomas E Kemble, all of his military records say Thomas James Kemble, and some of the newspaper reports give his surname as Kimble. It is not unusual to have minor errors or spelling mistakes.

From early September 1914 there are numerous mentions of T Kemble and H Gallant in the Felmersham column in the Beds Times, usually just saying that they were well with no further details. In January 1915 they were home on 72 hour leave, but in the next month, T Kemble was injured in the right thigh by shrapnel and spent several weeks in hospital. The hospital report gives his age as 30 with 9 years in the army of which 6 months were on current active service. Regular Beds Times reports continue until the middle of 1916.

He was killed in action in Flanders on 26th of March 1918 and his name appears on the Pozieres Memorial (panel 3). There is no mention of his death in any local papers. (ctd)

His service number started as 7383, but changed to 12740 sometime after early 1915.

Do let me know if you have any comments on this information. Perhaps you can throw some light on the two remaining names, Harry Burt and Albert S Smith. It may be the case that they only had a very loose connection with the village (billeted here or nearby?).

It would be good to have as complete a picture as possible of those from Felmersham and Radwell who gave their lives in the First World War.
