LETTER FROM Fr REUBEN PRESTON

We are confronted this April with the horror of Holy Week, the bewilderment of Good Friday and the astonishment of Easter Day.

As I write this it is on the day I travelled to London to look at the impact of the devastating events of Wednesday 24 March, with now 4 who have died as a result of the attack in Westminster. The atmosphere was tense and there was a sense of 'something odd' in the air. A feeling of disturbance filled the streets and the extra police presence couldn't help but cause me to feel uncomfortable – and, dare I say it, pleased to have moved from the capital to our villages. The evening witnessed the vigil in Trafalgar Square with the repeated motif of "We are not afraid" on banners, homemade tattoos, cards and in speeches.

During our remembrance of the events of Holy Week, Good Friday and Easter, our spirits travel through the gamut of human reactions to violence, betrayal, shock and disgust, through sorrow, bewilderment, horror, numbness and astonishment to peace-drenched joy. The Christian faith accompanies us in all of our humanness through the events of life and calls us to ask God for transformation of the evil into new life. It is easy to for us to want to ignore Holy Week and Good Friday and skip from Palm Sunday to Easter morning, as if taking spiritual antidepressants to numb the pain. But it is in the pain of our living that we can draw closer to God and allow the depths of our being to be touched by God's grace and presence and assurance, which then leads us in the renewed gravity of cry "Alleluia!" at the joy of the Easter resurrection new-life discovery.

Whatever the pains in your life, may you present them to God in the offering of Holy Week and find a Resurrection experience of your own. Happy Easter when it comes!



FELMERSHAM TO CARLTON WATER MAIN REPLACEMENT SCHEME WAT-06413 Natasha Tuke, Customer Service Lead (infrastructure)

We were thrilled to receive such a fantastic turnout at the customer drop-in session we held at Carlton Village Hall on Monday 20th February. The session was held to explain the work we'll be starting soon to replace the water main between Felmersham and Carlton which has suffered from numerous bursts in recent years. The replacement of this water main will ensure security of supply for the future and prevent further bursts in the area.

We were able to answer questions, explain the techniques that we are using to minimise disruption and show maps of the new pipeline to give residents an overview of the work. It was also an opportunity for us to gain a greater understanding of how our work may affect businesses and properties in the area. We had a positive response from the community overall and we thank you for your support.

We want to take this opportunity to assure residents that the only disruption to your water supply will be when we transfer your service pipe from the old main to the new main. We will give you at least two days advance warning of this and the connection itself will likely take less than two hours to complete.

We are looking to start work on 13th April 2017 and the first phase of the work will be off road, in the fields. If all goes to plan, we are hoping to complete the work at the junction between The Causeway and Felmersham Road in Carlton during the summer school holiday period to minimise disruption, as we will need to put some temporary road closures in place. However, this will be subject to liaison with the local authority. The whole scheme is due to be completed by March 2018, but we will provide regular updates throughout.

WI REPORT 'Journeys of a Yogi' Blanche Smith

Stuart Prince's journey was not just a physical voyage of discovery but the culmination of his life experiences that led him to become a Yogi. He explained that "a Yogi is someone who explores the mystic side of life". In 1972 at the age of 16 years Stuart joined the Merchant Navy as an apprentice on a Tramper, carrying cargo around the world. For 10 years he was a seafarer, becoming a Chief Deck Officer. He observed the blatant inequalities of life as a seaman, for example the exploitation of black people in America and South Africa. In 1982 Stuart joined the Metropolitan Police in London where for 25 years he was employed in the CID and in the Serious Crime Squad. Among his colleagues he became known as the 'Prince of Darkness' due to the nature of his work. He found yoga as a way of de-stressing from his job and discovered 'Karma' -(your actions have consequences) - and the philosophy that relates to contentment within ourselves and with the outside world. Stuart is now a Yogi and, as a teacher, attempts to pass on this philosophy to his students.
