Please support Christian Aid Week 14-20 May

Christian Aid has more than 70 years' experience of working in partnership to support communities to thrive. They tackle the root causes of poverty so that women, men and children the world over are strengthened against future knocks. And if disasters happen, they get people the help they want straight away.

British churches founded Christian Aid in 1945 to support refugees who had lost their homes and possessions in the Second World War. Twelve years later saw the launch of Christian Aid Week, so 2017 sees its 60th anniversary.

Christian Aid is based in countries affected by disasters so they can be there before, during and after an emergency to save lives and support people long term. Through their work with local organisations in these countries, they can talk directly to the people affected to provide the most useful emergency response.

As well as providing support for refugees in Europe, two ongoing appeals are:-

Nigeria Crisis Ongoing terrorist attacks have displaced around two million people in Nigeria. Christian Aid have launched a Nigeria Crisis Appeal to reach families in desperate need of food, water and shelter.

Violent attacks by terrorist group Boko Haram have affected millions of people. The scale of the Nigeria crisis is widespread, exceeded only by emergencies in Syria, South Sudan and Yemen. Yet media recognition has been slow.

Syria Crisis Syria and its people are in crisis as half of the population have had to flee their homes, and more than 4.9 million people are now refugees.

Christian Aid is working with partners in Syria, Lebanon and Iraq, providing support to some of the most vulnerable Syrian refugees. Within Syria itself, Christian Aid is supporting partners providing hot meals to people recently displaced by the bombing of towns such as those north east of Damascus.


