LETTER FROM Fr REUBEN PRESTON

A truly tragic event metered out with malicious and evil intent towards our way of life. The atmosphere of the Nation is changing as security levels are raised, and as political leaders work closely together for a few days and election campaigning is paused.

Tragedy calls us all to stop and take stock. It reminds us to cherish the moment of life we have with each other. It reminds us that life is fragile and can be taken at the blinking of an eye or the explosion of a bomb.

June is the month when we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost this year – recalling the work of God's Holy Spirit coming upon the disciples gathered in prayer. 

How can you do a full body workout without going to the gym? Try Nordic Walking with instructor Michelle Chalkley of 'Fresh Air Nordic Walking'. Michelle, who is based in Harrold, demonstrated the technique to us at our May meeting, before allowing us to have a go ourselves.

Nordic Walking was originally a summer training regime for cross country skiers. The specially designed poles harness the power of the upper body to propel the body forward as you walk, releasing tension in the back and shoulders, improving posture and gait, and strengthening back and abdominal muscles. It is now a recognised way to turn a walk into a whole body exercise that can be done by anyone anywhere.

In Finland, Nordic Walking is taught in schools and Michelle is currently trying to introduce it into our own schools as an alternative to traditional sports.

Our June meeting is a 'Drinks and Desserts' evening at the Sun pub and then we can all go Nordic Walking to shed the pounds!

UPDATE OF THE FELMERSHAM TO CARLTON WATER MAIN REPLACEMENT **SCHEME** Natasha Tuke, Customer Service Lead

We began our scheme to replace the water main between Felmersham and Carlton on 13th April as planned. The replacement of this aging water main will ensure security of supply for the future and prevent further bursts in the area.

Preparation activities are underway, involving fencing off the route and stripping back the top soil at a width of approximately 12 metres. This allows our machinery to navigate the route of the pipeline without damaging the topsoil. The same top soil we have removed will then be put back once the new pipeline has been installed.

We have started welding together large lengths of the new pipeline and laying it along the route, ready for it to be put into the ground. The pipeline is 250mm diameter and is made from a durable, long lasting Polyethylene (plastic) material. The wet weather over the last few weeks has slowed our progress slightly, but overall we are still on target to complete in March 2018.

In the coming weeks trenches will be excavated for the new pipeline and we will also be introducing a directional drilling machine. This machine enables the pipe to be installed without the need to dig trenches and will be used in sensitive areas, where there are large amounts of archaeology or major environmental constraints.

We are talking to Bedford Borough Councils Highways Department about when we can complete our work at the junction of The Causeway and Felmersham Road in Carlton. There is a clash between our proposed highway works and some bridge repair work at Oakley over the River Great Ouse, which may impact our plans to carry out this section of work in the summer holidays. We will send out a further update to the community once this has been clarified.
