LETTER FROM Fr REUBEN PRESTON

And what does the LORD require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.

Micah 6:8

As you receive this issue of Ouse News we shall be about to embark upon a new year in the life of the worldwide church and, as normal, in Advent this verse from the prophet Micah echoes in our heads and hearts as it sets the scene for our call to faith, our call to otherliness, our call to a spiritual life.

With the prospects of the C word on the horizon, the themes of JUSTICE, MERCY and HUMILITY are in the air as we get ready to welcome afresh the Christ-child into our hearts. This will be a difficult Christmas for those who have lost loved ones in the year past, those who have lost income, jobs, homes, partners.... but a great Christmas gift you can give to someone is a bit of time.

As we know that God gave us time in the person of Jesus – he gave us about 30 years of his time. We know that Jesus also became human – taking up space. The faith we are invited to participate in with Jesus is an embodied one – taking up space and time. The great theologian of the 1940s, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, writes about God choosing to take up physical space with us embodying JUSTICE, MERCY and HUMILITY.

In the weeks of Advent season and looking to Christmas, take some time for yourself and giving thanks for the fact that you are created and take up space, and that God delights in your specialness, as well as calling you into his spiritual intimacy as you celebrate the birth of the baby Jesus. Pray for the gifts of JUSTICE, MERCY and HUMILITY as you embark upon this season.

May the peace of the Christ-child dwell and emerge deep within you.



Has anyone not seen the bright yellow cabinet containing a Powerheart G5 AED on the front wall of The Sun? It can't really be missed!

Should you need to use the AED <u>first of all phone 999</u> and report the problem, they will dispatch an ambulance and also give you the code to open the cabinet. Once open just grab the device and take it away it has everything that is needed.

Although courses in using an AED are available training isn't essential as the device gives voice guidance - opening the case starts the process of talking you through each step. Once the pads are in place it monitors the heart beat and will not activate unless it's necessary, it may also instruct you do undertake CPR.

Details of the device can be found on the Powerheart website and there is also a YouTube video which shows how to use it. Go to www.felmersham.net/defib.htm for these links.

The AED and cabinet were donated by Bedfordshire Fire & Rescue Service and special thanks go to Martin Blizzard who donated his time and the materials to install it. (Although the G5 doesn't need to be recharged the cabinet has a small thermostatically controlled heating element to stop the pads getting too cold in winter. You wouldn't want the shock of a cold pad on your body would you!?). Thanks also to Peter Anthony who allowed it to be installed and pays for the electricity.

Finally the device checks itself regularly and has a Rescue Ready indicator which is normally green. The device is also checked regularly, but if you look through the small window in the cabinet and you see it has turned red, please contact me (781967) or the Clerk to the Parish Council.
