LETTER FROM Fr REUBEN PRESTON

Belonging - where do we feel we belong? July is a significant month for me because it is when I'm called to my monastery to celebrate St Benedict's Day on 11 July. I have been associated with Alton Abbey since I was a curate in 1991 when one of our congregation set out on the path of the Religious Life to become a monk in the Church of England. I visited him for years and then took the plunge to become an 'Oblate'. We live something of the shared life of the monastery, but at a distance and in ordinary life, sharing in prayer and study with other oblates around the country.

Benedict was born in Nursia, central Italy, around the year 480. As a young man he was sent to study in Rome, but was soon appalled by the corruption in society and withdrew to live as a hermit at Subiaco. He quickly attracted disciples and began to establish small monasteries in the neighbourhood. Around the year 525, a disaffected faction tried to poison him, so Benedict moved to Monte Cassino with a band of loyal monks. Later in life Benedict wrote his Rule for Monks, based on his own experience of fallible people striving to live out the gospel. He never intended to found an 'order' but his Rule was so good that it was disseminated and widely followed, becoming the model for all western monasticism. Benedict died at Monte Cassino in about the year 550. (ctd. overleaf)

In this month of July why not consider how you welcome the 'stranger'? How could you be more welcoming either at home or at work? So often we are caught up in our ordinary social routines; we miss the vitality and gift of the stranger to our lives.

When we get to 11 July - Happy St Benedict's Day.
