LETTER FROM Fr REUBEN PRESTON

If you look around the internet you will find that August was the *Word of the Day* on 23 August 2015 (https://www.merriam-webster.com/dictionary/august).

Our month of August was named after the first Roman Emperor in the 8th Century BC.

As the website says...."August comes from the Latin word *augustus*, meaning "consecrated" or "venerable," which in turn is related to the Latin *augur*, meaning "consecrated by augury or "auspicious." In 8 BC the Roman Senate honoured Augustus Caesar, the first Roman emperor, by changing the name of their month "Sextilis" to "Augustus." Middle English speakers inherited the name of the month of August, but it wasn't until the mid-1600s that "august" came to be used generically in English, more or less as "augustus" was in Latin, to refer to someone with imperial qualities."

This month is of course the month when we celebrate our **Patronal Festival** (we are keeping the celebration on **Sunday 12 August**) and this year's celebration has the title "BEHOLD I AM..." - words which we ascribe to Mary as she heard the invitation from the Angel Gabriel to be the bearer of Jesus in her womb. 



