

IMPORTANT UPDATE ON THE SUN

Clive and Rosalyn Just

After 5 years of ownership we have decided to sell The Sun public house. It is now a thriving and profitable business with the capacity to do even better with a little more investment and we believe it is a great opportunity for the right person or group.

Peter Anthony, the current tenant, would be happy to discuss carrying on should any new owner just want to "buy to let" and he has many ideas for developing the business further. However he is also prepared to move on should it be bought by someone who wants to run it themselves. The Sun was registered as an Asset of Community Value with came with an obligation to publicise the sale in case a local community group wanted to express, formally, an interest in putting in a bid. In which case the building could not be sold for 6 months to give the community group enough time to raise the money and make an offer. As the rules stand, at the end of the moratorium the owner of an ACV can decide who to sell it to, there is no obligation to accept the community bid.

Although The Sun is doing well at the moment on average 2 pubs per week close down and the property is worth much more as a house than a pub. A local pub was bought by someone who kept it open three years then tried to redevelop the site, though luckily had a change of heart. Other locals eg The Red Lion and Slaters Arms are seemingly still closed waiting for permission to develop. Community ownership prevents that from happening so please consider whether you could participate in such a scheme. If so let us know and we will put all like minded people in touch with each other. There are organisations to help community ownership and some grant funding for the process may be available.

Alternatively if you might consider buying The Sun yourself or know someone else who might - either as a good investment or to be the licensee - we will be happy to provide all the information you require.
