All of us have been moved (or touched) by a piece of music, a sunset, a starry sky or a poem. The capacity to be moved is an essential part of our humanity. Yet it remains a mystery. Winning the lottery gives us great joy, but it does not move us. Losing a favourite item of clothing makes us sad, but it is not moving. Being moved is more complex: to be touched by joy is to feel also a tinge of sadness; to be touched by sadness is inseparable from a tinge of joy.

There is a sense in which our feeling of being moved is a gift from heaven: it is outside our control and not a frequently felt emotion. Indeed, its infrequency makes it special, not commonplace. I was moved as a teenager when I heard the Overture to Tannhauser for the first time. Many years later I was moved by a celebration of Mass in Sacre Coeur, Paris. I have been moved by certain poems, by great mountains and by the vast expanse of the ocean.

In church each Sunday are we not anticipating that moment when the hand of God touches us and our hearts are uplifted? And, if we are honest, we know that there are numerous times in church when no such moment occurs. Yet, our (ctd.)



(Being Moved Ctd.) Christian faith tells us to be patient and not to lose hope: we wait for that divine moment, and it may only be a moment, when we are transported in our minds far away from the here and now. Perhaps it will happen at the taking of communion or during the intercessions or sermon; or perhaps when we hear the words of the "Jubilate Deo".

If it is to be relevant to people's lives, religious worship has to involve thinking about God in ways that make sense in 2018: we need to talk the language of ordinary people, not the jargon of a religious club. At the same time, however, our worship must create the conditions in which a worshipper may be moved (or touched) by something in the church service. Hence the importance of the liturgy. The challenge is how to reconcile the accessible and mundane with words and music that can uplift us.


