
Letter from Revd Dr Vicky Raymer

March is emerging like a lamb this year. Violets and daffodils are taking over from snowdrops. There isn't much that's edible in the garden but shops are full of fruit and veg from warmer climes.

It's strange to remember that in medieval England early spring was called the starving time. Grain supplies would be running out. Most meat would have been used up in the autumn, to preserve fodder for animals able to produce young in the spring. The Lenten fast was imposed in preparation for Easter. It also meant that everyone's diet changed, poor and (to an extent) rich endured hunger together and scarce resources were conserved.

Contemporary variations on the social solidarity of a shared change in diet are emerging. Young people influence the cuisine of colleges and restaurants and argue about ecological living over vegetarian menus with vegan options. Old and young can make common cause and learn from each other how to do better with less and enjoy it more. Conscious caring acts can deepen our awareness of the wondrous spring generosity of nature and prepare us to share in God's Eastertide generosity in love for the world.






