

The followed Morris and Maypole dancers, and recorder playing, and a play, "Sir Francis Drake", in which the principal characters were Davis Constant, Chris Lovell, Michael Podd, Brian Cockings, Terry Albury, George Lord, George brown, Terence Marsh, Peter Payne, Brian Norman and Geoffrey Hulatt. The programme ended with square dances and a folk dance.

The Rev A L Martin thanked the Head Mistress, Mrs W M Mellon, and Miss Taylor for a most enjoyable evening. A collection was taken for the school fund.

NEW BLUE PLAQUES HONOUR DYNAMIC VICTORIAN DUO

Joshua and Hester Hawkins — both extraordinary figures in Bedford's history — have been recognised with the unveiling of a new plaque. The fifth in a series of new blue plaques around the town, it's situated on the wall of 18 Linden Road, the couple's former address and now home to the YMCA.



As five times mayor, businessman and editor of the Bedfordshire Times, Joshua Hawkins was pivotal in the provision of some of Bedford's most recognisable landmarks including Bedford Park, the Embankment, County Bridge and the suspension bridge.

Also honoured on the plaque, Hester Hawkins was equally highly regarded in her capacity as a novelist, astronomer and hymn writer – the couple forming a formidable and impactful force.

Joshua Hawkins' name is preserved on four additional blue plaques throughout the town at County Bridge, Prebend Street; the Suspension Bridge; the old Fire Station, Mill Street and the main building at Bedford School.
