



FROM THE SECOND WORLD WAR ARCHIVES OF THE WELLS FAMILY THE BATTLE OF FELMERSHAM, SUNDAY 17TH MAY 1942

Dorothy Wells of Felmersham Grange, wife of Sir Richard Wells the Bedford MP, had nine children and typed newsletters to them, often twice or even three times a week, from 1935 to 1956.

By February 1942 three had been killed in action: Kit on the carrier HMS Glorious, Jimmy leading 600 Sqdn against the German invasion of Holland, and Tom (Beds & Herts Regt) at the fall of Singapore. All three are commemorated in Felmersham Church's east window.

This extract from a 1942 General News Bulletin (as Dorothy called them) tells her surviving children about the Battle of Felmersham and her grandchildren's part in it.

Some background to this account :-

Mrs Milburn is Mary, Dorothy's eldest daughter and the only child who did not end up in uniform in WW 2. She passed on about 15 years ago.

Sarah is Dorothy's other daughter who is still alive , about 97 now, and lives in Dorset.

Gepps is Mary's second daughter who lives locally and was tiny at the time, about 2..

Pooh is Mary's first who lives in the East Coast and is about 80 now, so would have been about 4 at the time.

Micky is a West Highland Terrier.

General News Bulletin - Monday May 18th 1942

What with one thing and another, we had quite an exciting week-end.... On Sunday Morning, Mrs Milburn and Sarah and Micky and I went to Church at 10, and did not notice anything out of the way; there was a full-scale Home Guard exercise on, with Regular Troops (from Sharnbrook) attacking Felmersham.

They kindly waited until after Church, and then I took Gepps [Georgina] out for her sleep, and seeing a lot of men along the Carlton Road, thought it would be quiet up in the orchard, so wheeled her up and down the grass paths for her morning sleep. But very soon we found we were right in the thick of the battle, with troops crawling about on all sides among the apple trees, guns going off all around, and a bomb in the top garden!

An innocent looking couple, man and girl, turned out to be 5th Columnists, and threw a bomb at our people: they had been in Church with revolvers and bombs in their pockets! (Weren't we grossly stupid not to have noticed? But would YOU have gone up to the innocent-looking people coming out of Church and demanded to search their pockets?)

So it was just about as noisy as could be, but dear old Gepps slept like a top through all the racket! We had about 8 officers of the Home Guard and Attacking Regiment in to sherry afterwards, and they told us that Felmersham had been jolly well guarded, and had repelled the attackers and put up a good show. So we were much gratified.

Mrs Milburn had Pooh [Philippa] along the Carlton Road and said Pooh was enchanted with the soldiers, and thought the grasses and leaves in their hats were a scream - she roared with laughter at them.... The battle was all over by about 12.20 and we had quite a peaceful afternoon.
