A Harvest Message from Revd Paolo Di Leo

Harvest season is a time when after a long period of preparation and cultivation farmers and gardeners know for sure if their efforts have been a success. They know that a successful harvest is never guaranteed. Every year farmers and gardeners apply their skills, experience and knowledge to produce a harvest. Each year they research and learn something new about the environment, their crops and then apply that learning in the hope of a harvest. They need to work hard and consistently apply all they have learned and experienced to ensure a good harvest.

I for one seem to be a past master at poor or failed harvests, mainly due to my lack of experience, understanding and skills to do with anything agrarian or horticultural. In my family I am famous for proudly declaring my horticultural achievements in the singular, such as the year I eventually produced 'a radish'!!!!

Now I could address this by researching and reading about the effects of the weather, soils, feeds etc and in so doing understand how to improve my chances of a better harvest. But research and reading alone will never produce a crop of anything. I would have to, as they say, 'get my hands dirty' and actually plant something and cultivate it. Without the actual experience of planting and cultivating all my research, reading and learning will never produce a single fruit, vegetable or flower.

And this principle applies to our lives. It is not only what we learn that matters but how we apply it. To use a farming and gardening term, 'we reap what we sow'. 

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING: 8 SEPTEMBER 2020 EDITED HIGHLIGHTS

Bedford Borough Council Libraries

The Borough Council is beginning the phased reopening of library services. Bedford Central and Kempston libraries opened on 20 August 2020 with a new 'Select and Collect' service, as well as for customers to return books they have had on loan during lockdown. Select and Collect gives customers the opportunity to borrow library books again by making requests based on their favourite genres or subjects, online or via the phone. Library staff will then choose books based on these preferences and issue them to customers, who will be notified when they are ready to collect from library entrances during Select and Collect opening times.

Customers will also be able to use the request service to choose specific titles through Arena, the online catalogue, and to pick them up from the library.

Overgrown Vegetation

Several parishioners have complained or commented upon a few instances in Felmersham where overgrown shrubs and hedges are obstructing the highway, restricting the footpath or obliterating traffic signs. There is a requirement on landowners to cut or trim hedgerow that overhangs a highway, road or footpath and that obstructs public access and, in this regard, the Parish Council urges you to keep your trees and hedges maintained in good order for the benefit of highway and footpath users. This would be most appreciated.



You are responsible for cutting your hedges back to the boundary of your property. Could you please respond to this matter as soon as you can. Your support in resolving this matter is appreciated.

Margaret Alleyway Memorial Garden (MAMG)

A large dead willow tree has been removed from the MAMG, three others have been pollarded and a further one fallen in the river has been removed. The surrounding hedges have been lowered to between 1.2 and 1.5 metres to discourage anti-social behaviour and the whole site has been made much more presentable. The Felmersham & Radwell Community Trust has re-opened the MAMG following the completion of the essential works and relaxation of the COVID -19 regulations.

Local Plan 2040

Bedford Borough Council had commenced work on a new local plan. The plan will set out how much growth is needed in the Borough in coming years (housing, jobs and associated infrastructure) and where it will take place. The recently adopted local plan looks ahead to 2030 and, in line with Government policy, this new local plan will extend the period that development is planned for beyond that date. Its main focus will be the allocation of new development sites to meet the Government's growth targets but it may also be appropriate to update existing or add new policies to guide decisions on planning applications and to repurpose the town centre.

A recent consultation identified the need to build up to 20,000 homes in the Borough during the period to 2040 and it would appear, from the locations identified in the consultation, that the intention of the Borough Council is to allocate land in North Bedfordshire for the majority of these new homes. The Parish Council is very keen to ensure that well respected and valued rural communities are not destroyed; the level of development envisaged by the Local Plan Review will vastly change the dynamics of these communities and there should be assurances given that existing rural settlements will not be further targeted for unacceptable growth.

Parish Councillors expressed serious concern at the impact of the significant level of growth proposed and, in particular, at the impact on the rural area given the poor infrastructure that exists to support growth. Further development in North Bedfordshire would put unprecedented strain on the local road networks particularly the A6 and the bottleneck "magic roundabout", with inevitable rat runs through the villages. It is considered that future justified growth should be concentrated on the A421 corridor where the environmental impact would be less significant and the new infrastructure that is already planned in the area would provide a well connected, accessible and sustainable location for growth. The A421 corridor, therefore, represents a much better location for growth and is better able to meet housing need without ruining the character of the Great Ouse Valley, thus making residents lives miserable through increased traffic and pressure on local services.

The Parish Council has responded to the consultation accordingly.
