#### The Serenity Prayer Revd Paolo Di Leo

The world often reveals itself as a hostile and unpredictable place. There are times when it feels like uncontrollable forces are unleashed that threaten us and activate fear in us. Throughout history, the human race has been subjected to a number of global threats — World Wars, Climate Change, Economic Crisis, Plagues. COVID-19 can now be added to this list.

Fear is a powerful emotion that is embedded into the very fabric of our humanity. It's an emotion that adapts, changes and informs our behaviour. It's part of our primitive survival mechanism. Without fear, our response to hostile and unpredictable forces would render us incapable of developing protective and lifesaving behaviour. Yet fear alone is not enough to ensure that we adapt and respond to threats in a positive and constructive way. Fear alone leads to insecurity and mistrust. It renders us vulnerable to being overwhelmed. Fear requires an antidote.

Hope is the antidote to the negative and paralyzing effects of fear. Hope that is grounded in the reality of life as it is, that acknowledges life's potential for tragedy, is so much more than wishful thinking. We are created to experience and react to fear, but we are also created to experience hope, joy, love and peace. We have options and choices in how we respond to the threats we perceive. We can let fear overwhelm us or can try to alleviate fear by denying that there are any threats at all. Conversely, we can let the experience of fear, coupled with the prospect of hope, lead us to loving, positive and redemptive actions that will seek to counter the threat ahead of us. Through the prism of hope, fear can be focused on eliminating threats and preserving life, because hope enables us to feel and see a better future.

Hope in a better future is soaked in a desire and love for that future, which cannot help but overflow towards others in seeking a common collective faith and vision of arriving at that future. It is a love and faith that does not deny fear, but acts in hope, many times unknowingly reaching out to the divine and unexpectedly bringing God into focus. (Ctd. overleaf)

In the UK, coronavirus vaccines will only be available via the National Health Service (NHS). You can be contacted by the NHS, your employer, a GP surgery or pharmacy local to you, to receive your vaccine. Remember, the vaccine is <a href="free of charge">free of charge</a>. At no point will you be asked to pay.

- . The NHS will never ask you for your bank account or card details.
- . The NHS will never ask you for your PIN or banking password.
- The NHS will never arrive unannounced at your home to administer the vaccine.
- The NHS will never ask you to prove your identity by sending copies of
  personal documents such as your passport, driving licence, bills or pay slips.

If you receive a call you believe to be fraudulent, hang up. If you are suspicious about an email you have received, forward it to **report@phishing.gov.uk**. Suspicious text messages should be forwarded to the number **7726** which is **free of charge**.

#### IN MEMORY OF A CHURCHWARDEN

In over forty years of living in Felmersham, Ken Shrimpton did so much for the village and the church. His interests were broad, and his faith and moral compass had its outlet in the community he served. Always actively involved in the church, he did much to facilitate the ongoing repairs and developments needed to keep a medieval building functioning well, so we have much for which to thank him.

He has requested donations in his memory to go to the Restoration Fund for St. Mary's and some people have already given, for which we are most grateful. At a time when so many charities are struggling for income, and the Benefice is also asking for help with the COVID Relief Fund which is there to help families, it is hard to ask for money for a building. However, the church boundary wall is collapsing in places and vulnerable in others. The worse it gets, the more it will cost and whilst grants are available, they are mostly given with match funding, so we have to find some money up front.

Our magnificent church was close to Ken's heart so if you feel able to contribute a little or a lot to helping us minimise the damage of wear and tear, it will secure a bit more of his legacy to our villages.

#### Ken Shrimpton 1935 - 2021

Ken Shrimpton who died earlier this month, was a lifelong churchman. He started life in Park Road, Stony Stratford and as a boy he attended St Giles Church where he was an altar boy and sang in the choir and later became a server. St Giles later amalgamated with St Mary's, Stony Stratford. He described it as high church which he enjoyed.

Ken and Lorraine, with Jane and Philip, moved to Felmersham in October 1973. The house was owned by Miss Childs who had been head teacher at the school (now a house) and Ken was delighted that his children had one year at a Church of England school!

Church having always been a part of Ken's life, he soon became involved with St Mary's and continued being involved until he died. He immersed himself in the care and maintenance of the church and was instrumental in many projects including, in particular, the restoration of the West Front. For the Millennium he organised the design and installation of the window in the Memorial Chapel and instigated and helped to develop the Millennium Time Capsule, which is hidden in the church. Refurbishment of the church porch was another of his projects, as was construction of the new vestry, and he was quietly proud that he designed the symbol representing St Mary's on the Benefice stationery. For a long time he designed the header for Ouse News, many of the photographs coming from his vast archive of village photography – yet another string to his bow.

Ken had many interests, one of which was historic churches. He belonged to the Beds and Herts Historic Churches Trust and visited many churches over the years (Ctd.)

and became very knowledgeable. He also ran this end of Bike and Hike for many years, which is a Beds and Herts Historic Churches Trust event. He was fascinated by church clocks and was proud that he had managed to automate the clock in St Mary's so that he wouldn't have to keep going up into the tower to wind it up!

In a life so full of endeavour Ken also wrote two books about Felmersham and Radwell: 'Felmersham – The History of a Riverside Parish' and 'Bygone Felmersham and Radwell'. His research was meticulous, and these books have been read by people from far and wide. To keep abreast of the times, at the beginning of the 21<sup>st</sup> century Ken set up a website for the village – felmersham.net – which he managed and updated on a regular basis. This is not only used by villagers but by people from far afield. Thankfully this continues under the watchful eye of Clive Just.

Pinchmill Players featured very much in Ken's life. It all began when he joined with a group of like-minded people to produce an Old Time Music Hall to raise funds for the school. Ken was involved with the Players right until the last production. He was in some of the shows and plays and his Fagin in Oliver was a critical triumph. He would help with anything including building the stage each time they had a production, working backstage etc. This was typical Ken, doing all he could to make a success of whatever he put his hand to. From the Players he and Lorraine started the Walking Group and he went on every walk (of which there were over fifty), continuing on his own after Lorraine had died. He loved the fun and wonderful friendships that were formed during those years.

Ken liked to keep fit and for many years he went to the Robinson Pool very early in the morning and swam before he went to work. As we have mentioned, he enjoyed walking and became involved in the P3 walking forum in the village. He would often be seen

walking through the villages, passing the time of day with those he met along the way. He liked to talk whether it be about engineering, architecture, nature, photography or even current issues. He had strong opinions on many subjects and woe betide anyone trying to persuade him otherwise!

Ken worked for W.H.Allen Sons and Co. in Bedford. They were manufacturers of diesel engines, pumps and steam turbines. Ken was an engineer and global trouble-shooter for Allen's equipment for most of his career. He was involved in so many aspects of village life that it would be difficult to mention them all here but everyone will have fond memories of Ken. He was a remarkable man and had a huge influence in this parish. He was funny, a gentleman, the man to go to, a voice to be heard. As has been said many times, he will be greatly missed by all of us but most of all by Jane and Philip and all his family to whom we convey our heartfelt sympathy and condolences. JW, JR
