

Happy 'Belated' Birthday Your Majesty

The 21st of April seemed to pass by like any other day. However, I would imagine that for the Queen despite it being her 95th birthday, it was a day of silent grief, reflection and sadness following the funeral of her beloved husband Prince Philip.

I read with interest some of the headlines surrounding her birthday, and one that

struck me was on the BBC website (https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/uk-56811715) where she focused on thanking us the British public and many around the world. In the article she said, "My family and I would like to thank you for all the support and kindness shown to us in recent days." It is extraordinary but not untypical that at this time which is perhaps one of the most difficult times in her life, she turns her mind and heart to think of her family and others, and to thank others for the kindness and support shown.

Through the days and weeks following Prince Philip's death there has been no 'grandstanding' 'theatrics' 'self-acclamations' 'self-pity' 'self-publicity' 'self-focus', ... I could go on. Rarely have I experienced a global leader of such historical import: past, present and in the future, who has not used such a time as this to increase their historical, political, economic, social or personal status and position.

It's noteworthy that she could have used Prince Philip's passing to produce a documentary, write a book, make a film, create a twitter storm, be interviewed by the global media or in fact start her own Holly-Flix reality show. Any of the above would I am certain have made her an instant billionaire. Yet her focus has been on family, public service and her calling to be a monarch dispensing her duties and obligations in and through dedicated service and resolute values.

We are called in the Bible to pray for all our leaders. St Paul and St Peter both pillars of our faith and church tell the early Christian church to "Honour everyone. Love the family of believers. Fear God. Honour the emperor" (1Peter 2:17) and that "supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, for kings (Ctd. Page 3)

(Romans 13:1).

If you have no prayer of your own to offer, then perhaps you may like to use the beautiful words from the Book of Common Prayer below:

"We beseech thee also to save and defend all Christian Kings, Princes, and Governors; and specially thy servant ELIZABETH our Queen; that under her we may be godly and quietly governed: And grant unto her whole Council, and to all that are put in authority under her, that they may truly and indifferently minister justice, to the punishment of wickedness and vice, and to the maintenance of thy true religion, and virtue."


