FINDS AT ROSE COTTAGE, THE HIGH ROAD, FELMERSHAM

Many thanks to the Hoyles from Rose Cottage who have given the items to the Village

Archives as shown in the photograph. It is said that Rose Cottage was used as a vicarage in the early 1600s.

The small pot, padlock and clay pipe were found behind a door post when a new door was being fitted to the stairway at the side of the inglenook. The two glass bottles were found in the garden when it was being landscaped. The brown bottle has MILTON on the bottom.

They have also donated some black and white photos of the

cottage and some aerial views of the vicinity, as well as the original copy of the John Bull Magazine from April 17, 1954, which featured a painting of Felmersham by K J Petts. This


