By the time this drops through your door the local harvest will mostly have been gathered in. At time of writing the tractors are still rushing up and down the road will trailers full of grain and I am reminded of the debt of gratitude we owe to our farmers who work so hard around the country to keep us all fed. 


New Parish Councillor

Traffic Data for July and August

The following traffic data is available from the installed speed activation devices:

Felmersham traffic monitoring: the highest speed recorded was 43mph and there were 45 instances where speeds were recorded at or above 35mph.



70mph and there were 29 instances where speeds were recorded at or above 60mph.

Overgrown Vegetation

Several parishioners have complained or commented upon a few instances in Felmersham where overgrown shrubs and hedges are obstructing the highway, restricting the footpath or obliterating traffic signs. There is a requirement on landowners to cut or trim hedgerow that overhangs a highway, road or footpath and that obstructs public access and, in this regard, the Parish Council urges you to keep your trees and hedges maintained in good order for the benefit of highway and footpath users. This would be most appreciated.



You are responsible for cutting your hedges back to the boundary of your property. Could you please respond to this matter as soon as you can. Your support in resolving this matter is appreciated.
