#### **Unlikely Blooms**

My front garden is surrounded by old and decaying tarmac. Yet remarkably I have a beautiful variety of plants that have freely sprung up in vibrant resistance to the hostile, sterile and barren expanse which is my driveway. Delicate flowers unfurl, in a kaleidoscope of resilience and beauty, where one might expect only barrenness. In silent annoyance, I wonder why they do not do this when I deliberately plant them in the flower beds painstakingly prepared for them!

They seem to be telling me something. Their vibrant hues and delicate forms whisper of an underlying beauty that transcends adversity, a testament to the innate strength that resides within them even in the most hostile of environments. With gentle defiance these flowers flourish despite all the odds. What came to mind was that even in the harshest environments, life finds a way.

These unassuming blooms embody a quiet peace, a steadfastness that belies their surroundings. In their unlikely and unwavering presence, they offer a sanctuary of tranquillity, a reminder that peace can be found even amidst hostility, hopelessness and chaos. Their resilience speaks of hope, faith and a gentle assurance that life will always find a way to bloom, no matter the obstacles. I felt they were saying to me "despite where I am and the difficulties I have faced, I will still live and love".

The emergence of these flowers from such an inhospitable environment serves as a powerful metaphor for the human spirit. It reminds us of our own capacity to overcome adversity, to find beauty in unexpected places, and to nurture faith and hope even in the darkest of times. The flowers vibrant presence echoes the teachings of Jesus, who urged his followers to seek peace, spread love, and to have faith that leads to hope despite hostility and adversity. These flowers remind us that even in the most barren and hostile of landscapes, seeds of love, faith and hope can always take root and flourish.

And now these three remain: faith, hope and love.

But the greatest of these is love.

#### Rooms now available at Emmaus Village Carlton for people experiencing homelessness

Bedfordshire homelessness charity Emmaus Village Carlton has seven vacant rooms in its community ready to support people away from homelessness.

The charity in Carlton Village accommodates up to 42 formerly homeless people

by providing them with a home, individual support and work opportunities within a community setting.

Recently the charity assisted more people in its community in moving onto independent living, leaving seven rooms available for anybody experiencing, or at risk of homelessness.

Each resident who lives at Emmaus (known to the charity as a companion) has their own bedroom, with all living expenses covered and meals provided in a communal dining room. There is no time limit on how long people stay at Emmaus, giving companions stability and an opportunity to break the cycle of homelessness.

#### Donna-Louise Cobban, Chief Executive at Emmaus Village Carlton, said:

"We're delighted to have rooms now available for new companions to come and join us. We are always pleased to support people staying with us to transition on to independent living, when the time is right for them.

"We are also preparing some of our current companions to transfer into our move-on flats to prepare them for the next part of their journeys, which is a very rewarding part of the work we do.

"As well as providing vulnerable people with a secure home, we give them the opportunity to regain their self-esteem and support them to rebuild their lives."

All companions who live at Emmaus contribute to the community with work opportunities in the charity's social enterprises. In exchange for this voluntary work, companions receive an allowance based on the living wage, work experience, training and leisure activities, plus a variety of support services as well as a place to call home.

#### **Harrold-Odell Country Park**

As with any other year, the wildlife within the park has had mixed fortunes and this year, due to the wet and colder spring, we have had fewer butterflies to watch as they flutter by. The 2 pairs of swans in the park have had two small broods this year and we were able to confirm breeding for little egrets for the first time, with 3 youngsters in one nest. Unlike last year, the common terns did not appear to be affected by the bird flu this year and 16 chicks have been seen being fed by their busy parents! By now, our summer migrants have already started to depart for their wintering grounds which can be around the Mediterranean or south of the Saharan desert with some British swallows known to winter in South Africa! The onset of Autumn will bring the winter migrants to our shores from places like Scandanavia, Russia, Germany, Belgium and The Netherlands.

In July, we celebrated our 17<sup>th</sup> Green Flag Award in a row. It wouldn't be possible to achieve this level of success without the help and support of this wonderful community! Our amazing volunteers work hard day in, day out to make this park such a wonderful place to be!

In September, we expect works to be undertaken to replace and/or repair the old ramp up to the café. We understand that there will be some disturbance whilst they are here, but we will try to keep this to a minimum and access to the café and toilets will be possible throughout the works.

The Friends of HOCP are producing a calendar for 2025. The photo competition closed in July, but we hope you managed to get your entries to us in time - we got to choose the best entries from some truly wonderful images. In late September the calendar will be available for sale in The Dragonfly Café.

Our popular I Spot, Children's Activity and Crossword booklets are available to buy for just £1 from the cafe. They're all great activities to occupy the kids in your life and motivate them to learn and get round the park!

Every other Thursday, there are health walks around the park and/or local area. Meeting at 10:30am at the woodland entrance to the Dragonfly Café, they last about 1 hour. The dates are 5<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup> September, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup> & 31<sup>st</sup> October and 14<sup>th</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup> November. In September and October, we will be looking forward to the autumn migration season and we will be getting our gloves dirty with habitat management works. There is always lots to get done around the park, but especially so outside of nesting season!
