This Thing Called War

Ernest Carwithen

On Remembrance Day we remember the brave men and women who died fighting for their country. We also pray that "the peace of God which passeth all understanding" may enter human hearts, so that we may live without war.

In 1940, my grandmother, Caroline Carwithen, wrote of the impact war had on her as a mother -

Monday's telegram simply read, "Arriving tonight - Den."

But why? His leave was not due.

I sat down, my knees trembling. Then, for some reason, I recalled part of Den's last letter – "Three of my pals went across while I was home on leave, Mother. I'm going to miss them." I found myself repeating, "Please God, not that."

He came at eight, having travelled a night and a day to reach me. He looked curiously detached and grave, and he said quietly, "It's embarkation leave, Mother."

"How long?" I asked.

"Until I get a telegram." I was silent. We talked long into the night.

We had breakfast late the next morning, after which he went to our nearest town, sixteen miles away, to put his affairs in order.

I watched him walk down the garden path, six feet tall, broad of shoulder, and oh so smart. The winter sun glinted on his fair hair, and his grey eyes were steady as he waved goodbye from the gate. My boy whom I had reared so carefully - but for what?

At four o'clock the bell rang. The telegram had arrived. (Ctd overleaf)





The purpose of Community Care is to provide occasional, short-term help for anyone in the parish with reduced mobility or who are elderly and need support to access appointments, go shopping etc.

The scheme is not intended to replace other services that are available (such as the bus service) or to do the work of other businesses such as gardeners, dog walkers etc. that might be needed on a regular basis.

Community Care has been going for 27 years. With your help and co-operation we hope to continue for another 27 years
