Friends Revd Paolo Di Leo

The Beatles' enduring anthem, "With a Little Help from My Friends", distils a fundamental human truth: the necessity of friendships. This sentiment, far from being a mere pop lyric, resonates with the profound relational dynamics articulated within scripture and illuminated by the astute observations of C.S. Lewis.

In the Old Testament, Exodus 33:11 offers a striking portrayal of intimacy: Moses, we are told, spoke to God "face to face, as a man speaks to his friend." This speaks to friendship being a divine gift or even revealing the divine amongst us as we nurture friendships and find and make friends.

This Godly concept of friendship finds its divine climax in the New Testament. In John 15:15, Jesus, addressing his disciples, declares, "I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you." Here, Jesus elevates his followers from a state of servitude to one of friendship, sharing with them the very essence of his divine understanding. This act of revelation signifies that friendship, in its truest form, is more than mere acquaintance, but incorporates a profound exchange of heart, mind and spirit.

C.S. Lewis, in his seminal work, "The Four Loves," dissects the genesis of genuine friendship with characteristic precision. "Friendship arises out of mere Companionship when two or more of the companions discover that they have in common some insight or interest or even taste which the others do not share and which, till that moment, each believed to be his own unique treasure (or burden)." The moment of recognition, the sudden realisation (Ctd)



"The typical expression of opening Friendship," Lewis observes, "would be something like, 'What? You too? I thought I was the only one.'" This 'fortuitous echo' as one might term it, is the very essence of finding a friend.

True friendship necessitates more than just a connection or acquaintance. It must by its very nature be a commitment offering support. A friend is present in times of need, offering practical assistance, emotional support, and unwavering encouragement.

With a little help from our friends, we can truly unearth the divine nature of friendship, a treasure of priceless value, a treasure God wishes us to have with himself and with others.

River Pollution Update

The April results for this year not yet being available, here are the e-coli results for this time last year which gives a rough indication of where we are this year. (The result for Sharnbook relates to the brook and not to the river.) The picture in the winter is usually a lot more serious but all sewage outfalls are now discharging more than regulations allow. Many of our visitors will not be aware that the Odell sewage works is just round the bend in the river and a few people have reported illness after leisure activities in this and other parts of the river. The Parish Council has put up a notice to raise awareness. The work of monitoring is continually developing, organised by the Bedfordshire Great Ouse Valley Environmental Trust. www.Bedsgovet.org Follow this link to see what action is being considered:

As part of the Outreach programme, Bedsgovet with Bedford College are encouraging schools to take an interest in the effects on their local environment. A group of 'Eco warriors' from Pinchmill school is carrying out their own monthly tests of Nitrate and Phosphate content in the river as part of an environment project, recording and observing.
