Rest and relaxation

And so we come to August and people think about relaxing – time out in the garden, on the beach (by the seaside or by Felmersham Bridge!), chilling out with friends and family. And then before long, we'll be back to school, back to work – except for the retired folk, who have even busier diaries. The stress and pressures of life are a worry and concern.

Fortunately, the Christian faith has some practices that may help. The first is the ancient Jewish idea of the Sabbath. The fourth of the Ten Commandments is to 'remember to keep the Sabbath day holy' (and our word holiday means literally 'holy day'). A holy day is a day different from all the others. Traditionally that has been Saturday for Jewish people. Even God took rest on the seventh day after he had created the world, says the priestly writer of the Book of Genesis, and the idea of taking a complete day of sabbath rest from Friday sundown to Saturday sundown is a distinctive practice of Jewish people to this day. Christians have adopted Sunday as a day of rest, to remember Jesus' rising again on Easter Sunday – the start of a new creation. The crucial point about a sabbath is to take a break from work, and spend some time just being, relaxing, thinking about God, praying, ready to start at work again on Monday.

The second is the practice of silence and meditation. Thanks to the Buddhist religion, mindfulness has become popular in recent years. What is not so well known is that Christians have been practising meditation for centuries, going back at least to the Egyptian 'Desert Fathers' in the third century AD, who withdrew from the world for a while, aspiring to be still. This way they could empty the mind in order to meet God – although they did not neglect hospitality to strangers.

Not everyone can take Sunday as a whole day of rest and recovery. Vicars can't, for example! Before I retired I used to take Tuesdays as my special day. (ctd)

Public participation was extended to allow residents and council to discuss concerns regarding the Appeal at land east side of Pavenham Road.

Overgrown Vegetation: A Further Reminder

Several parishioners have complained or commented upon several instances in Felmersham and Radwell where overgrown shrubs and hedges are obstructing the highway, restricting the footpath or obliterating traffic signs. There is a requirement for landowners to cut or trim hedgerow that overhangs a highway, road or footpath and that obstructs public access and, in this regard, the Parish Council urges you to keep your trees and hedges maintained in good order for the benefit of highway and footpath users. This would be most appreciated.

Topical issues

Two of the oldest Village Entrance Gates are going to be refurbished to match the one replaced earlier this year.

Access to Pinchmill Islands - the Borough's Rights of Way officer has written to landowners requesting the new stile is made more dog and pedestrian friendly.

The Clerk is chasing the return of the repaired speed monitor device and following several complaints of speeding traffic in Felmersham & Radwell and will enquire as to the availability of average speed cameras between the two river bridges.
