For many this is the season of examinations. Often this is a testing time not only for the candidates, but also for the rest of the family. So much can seem to hang upon the results that it is often a time of great pressure and tension. Exams are important but it is necessary to keep a sense of proportion. During the exams it is important to concentrate and to perform as well as you are able but when they are over do not to dwell on the possible results. What is done is done, and no amount of worrying will alter that. The time spent waiting for results should not be allowed to feel like waiting in the condemned cell. By all means consider the various ways forward that depend on the outcome of the examinations, but try not to be too pessimistic. Think of all the energy that will have been wasted in worrying should the results be better than was believed possible. Life will go on whatever the results, although its direction may not be exactly as was wished. Throughout our lives we will undergo tests of many different types. Often our lives will be affected by the outcomes of the tests, and sometimes we may be disappointed with the direction that life takes. But sometimes what seemed to be a disadvantage will, in time, prove to much better than we could have imagined. Those who have committed their lives to Jesus are warned that their journey through life will not always be easy, that they may undergo very challenging tests on the way. Sometimes they may come to believe that God has deserted them that they have in some way failed and become lost on the way. This is no time for resting and feeling sorry for themselves. It is a time to seek God in prayer, and to learn again his will for them. In years to come they may well come to see that this time which seemed to be a time of failure proves to be a turning point which brought them closer to God and deepened their involvement in discipleship.

I hope that all those undergoing examinations will achieve the results that they require, and move on to the next part of life's journey. In fact they will move on to the next part of the journey whatever the results, even though the journey may not take the direction that they expected.

Felmersham and Radwell Parish Council

At the meeting held on the 3rd May 2005, the Chairman, David Cook was re-elected, as was Vice-Chairman Michael Thomas. The meeting was attended by all Parish Councillors and several members of the public. Also attending was our new Beat Officer, PC Rob Smith, following several incidents of vandalism and anti-social behaviour in the parish. PC Smith urged residents to report all such incidents to the Police, and if necessary to ask for an incident number to make sure the calls are logged.

The damage to the bus shelter at Radwell was discussed. It was decided it would not be economically viable to re-build and the Council will look at other designs which would be more in keeping with the location.

Following a question regarding the cutting of verges, the Clerk advised that these are cut to one metre width only. There is a problem on wide verges when undergrowth and brambles grow out from hedges.

A meeting with the Chief Planning Officer regarding the proposed new playing field at Felmersham had been positive. However, he would like to see evidence that parishioners are in favour of the scheme – a playing field in return for plots for two new houses. This will be included in the Vital Village questionnaire which, following trials, is about to be distributed.

The next meeting will be on Tuesday 5th July at 7.30 pm.

LINCROFT SCHOOL FUND RAISING

Lincroft School is currently fundraising for a first class sporting and arts facility to be opened in January 2006. Not only will present and future pupils benefit but also past pupils and the entire community served by the school.

The school has raised about 80% of the project costs through a combination of fundraising and capital grants. Nevertheless we remain short of the overall funding we need to realise the full scheme (albeit tantalisingly close!).

The School would be interested in any ideas that would support our efforts. We are planning a very prestigious opening of the new facilities and full acknowledgement of the support the school has received will be prominently advertised and displayed. The following are suggestions only – we would be keen to accept support ‘in kind’ or benefit from any ideas offered:

We would also invite more significant contributions to the development from benefactors or companies wishing to help build a legacy, with the School and the community as beneficiaries. There is an opportunity to contribute, as a significant sponsor, to one of the discrete developments of the project.

These include: a new music room; a music practice area; a drama and dance studio; the redeveloped school hall (already used extensively by the local community); the sports hall (4 badminton court size); and, the refurbished changing rooms (suitable for adults to use during evenings and weekends).

We are interested in providing better sports and arts facilities for the disabled. This could mean, for example, the provision of disabled changing and bathroom facilities, and the further extension of access to the facility

We are aiming to launch a major raffle and would be very interested in any ideas or donations for prizes. We hope to extend the scope of our fundraising further afield because of the quality of the prizes we would be offering. Points of sale and collection points for raffle tickets in the Bedford area would be a great help. We will be holding our Summer Fête on Saturday, 18th June. If you are interested in helping or perhaps running your own stall please contact the School. All proceeds have been earmarked for the project.

We are also looking for mutual support from local clubs and societies. For example, the provision of equipment and resources that could be used jointly by a community group and the School (e.g. 5-a-side goals, indoor cricket nets and matting, demountable staging and arts equipment, badminton posts and nets etc). The School operates a generous concession to hire facilities for local community organisations.

We look forward to hearing from interested individual, organisations and businesses – any help, regardless of scale, and fresh ideas would be great.
