Parish Council AGM

7 Parish Councillors, the Clerk, County Councillor Gershon, Borough Councillor Brandon, PCSO Taylor and 1 member of the public attended this meeting.
Peter Hartop was re-elected Chairman of the Parish Council and Marjorie Pipe re-elected Vice Chairman.

Allan Taylor is the new Community Support Officer for 15 parishes in the Carlton, Harrold, Riseley and Sharnbrook wards working with PC Rob Smith. Their number is 01234 275175. He reported that crime figures for Felmersham and Radwell were down on the previous year. Most nuisance reports have been in relation to Moor End Lane and youths possibly drug taking. Police patrols have increased in this area and work is being carried out on the wider issue.

Matters Arising: Rubbish bins are still not being emptied. Clerk to contact DSD.

Planning: Application for a wind farm at Nunn Wood has been withdrawn but is unlikely to go away. (All planning applications/results are in the minutes).

Highways: Problems with hedges overhanging the highway were reported. These will be passed to County Highways for action. A complaint was received about the surface of the road between Radwell and Milton Ernest. This is scheduled to be resurfaced and the Council will try to get the date moved forward. Discussion took place regarding the size and type of the proposed speed activated sign in Felmersham. A note from a member of the public asked that it should be small and compact and to be operated by mains power. Resurfacing of Marriotts Close will take place between 1st May and 30th June.

Radwell: New seat to be installed on the bus shelter base and the area tidied.

Parish Plan: A Steering Committee meeting is to be arranged.

Finance: The Parish Council had applied for a £20,000 grant from Bedford Borough Council to re-equip the playing field. The Borough has offered £10,000 which will not be sufficient. The Council intends to appeal. A letter had been received signed by several youngsters in the village requesting that the playing field facilities be improved.
